

Red Sox Turn On Steam, Rip Carroll by 11-2

ESTHERVILLE, IA.—The Estherville Red Sox turned on three Carroll pitchers for an 11-2 victory here last night to send the Merchants down to their third successive loss on the road.

Carroll moves over to Bancroft tonight to take on the ever-dangerous Lions in hopes of snapping the season's longest losing streak.

After tonight's date with Bancroft, Carroll completes its road trip at Mason City Thursday night. The Merchants return home to play Spencer Friday night. Spencer lost to Mason City last night, 5-3, to blow its chance of taking over the Iowa State league leadership.

Estherville bombed big Bob Offerjost off the hill in the first inning to nick him for the loss. The only man retired during Offerjost's short stay on the mound was a man attempting to stretch a double into a three-bagger.

Stan Gwinn was Estherville's big gun last night. He batted home six runs with a single, double and home run (off Bill Falt with the bases jammed).

Jack Kaley teed off on Offerjost's first hit to bounce a double off the boards. Jim McNulty walked and then came doubles by Gwinn, Sid Langston and Joe DiMartino. That ended Offerjost's hurling and brought on Wayne Paige.

Paige sailed along in fine style until the fifth. Pitcher George Davidson, who had quite a night for himself (a neat eight-hitter and a three-for-three batting performance) walked. Kaley bunted him up a notch, but McNulty whiffed. Then came singles just out of the reach of fielders off the bats of Gwinn and Langston for two runs.

In the sixth, the Red Sox added more insurance runs on Ray Angle's single, a walk, Davidson's one-baser and McNulty's two-ply wallop.

Falt came on to pitch after Paige was lifted for a pinch hitter in the seventh. He escaped damage in the seventh, but gave up a double to Davidson, two walks and Gwinn's grand slammer.

Carroll's first run came on Falt's home run in the seventh. In the ninth, Lloyd Randol and Sheehan singled, but Bruce Benson whiffed. Falt's drive bounded off the boards in right field, but it went for a single and loaded the bases. Randol held up thinking the ball might be caught.

Jack Baldwin, forced Falt at second as a run scored and Denny Rinaldi fled out to end the rally. Davidson gave up eight hits, three in the last inning as he struck out eight and walked only two batters.

Dick Giedlin Added; Carroll Roster Set for Rest of Year

Several Other New Players To Join Club

The Carroll Merchants last night filled its 18-man roster to complete the 1951 season and Iowa State league play-off, should the Merchants be able to hold in one of the top four spots in the final league standings.

Most important name added to the roster yesterday was that of Dick Giedlin, the ex-Notre Dame first sacker, who was one of the principal belters in Carroll's lineup last year.

He'll be in uniform Friday when the Merchants return home from the current road trip.

Giedlin, a fancy fielding left-hander, will probably take over first base and that will send heavy-hitting Bill Evans to an outfield berth to bolster the offense.

Giedlin, whose home is at Trenton, N. J., batted .316 last year. He hit 12 homers and 11 doubles. His runs batted in total was 46, and he led the league in runs scored with 65.

Other newcomers added to the Carroll roster as the deadline neared were Pitcher Freddie Welch, Elliott, Ia., veteran who has pitched in southwest Iowa for several years; Pitcher Gifford Rich, transfer from Lakes-Denison; Rex Clemmer, .313 hitting outfielder from Lakes-Denison; Jack Baldwin, late of Bancroft.

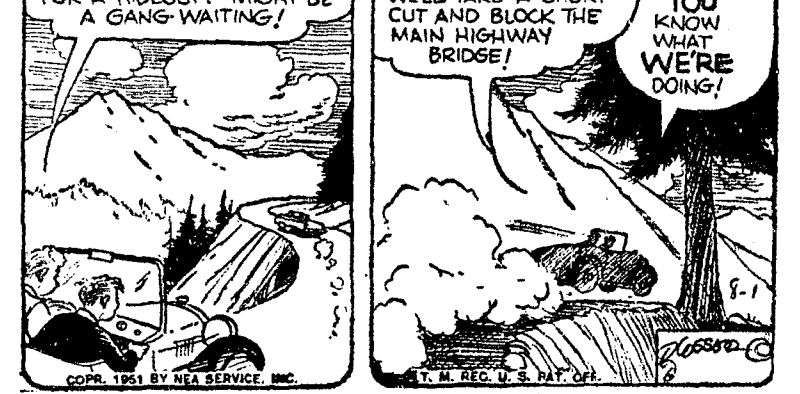

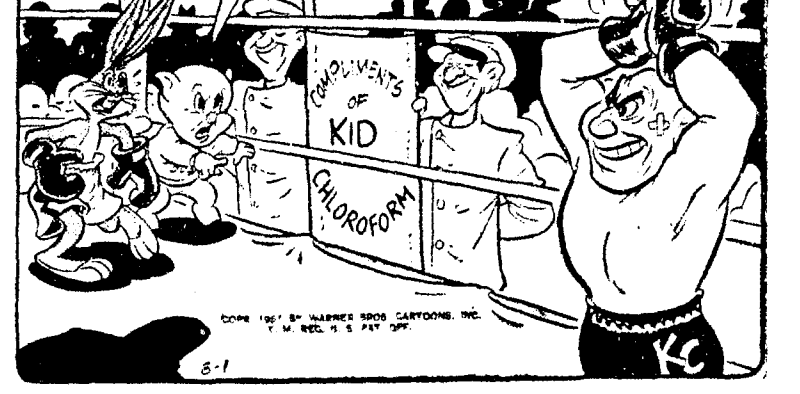

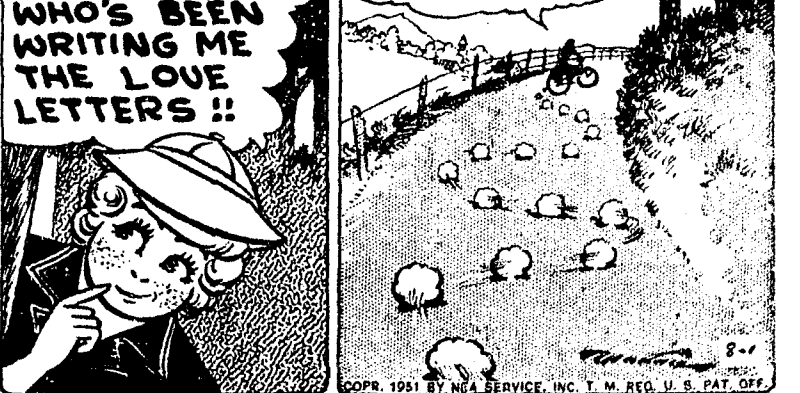
