## Bayard Boys May Share in \$11,585.51 They Found

BAYARD (AP) — Visions of the modern day version of sugar plums, like rockets, and guns and bikes, danced in the head of 12 boys Thursday, and who could blame them?

They figure they may get to share in at least 10 per cent of \$11,585.51 they uncovered in a vacant lot Tuesday in this quiet Guthrie County town astride Highway 141.

Wary officials completed the sorting and counting of old currency, gold pieces, pennies and silver coins Wednesday at the Farmers State Bank.

They said the total may even surpass the \$11,585 figure, depending on the contents of two packets of wet, crumbling currency they were unable to count.

The boys, 6 to 12 years of age and members of the "Space Cadets Club," found the money buried in cans and jars on property once owned by a thrifty spinster who just didn't trust banks.

Now the big question is how much will the lucky lads get to spend, or save, as the case may be.

C. F. Greenfield, Guthrie County attorney, said the amount may depend on whether the cache is considered as "abandoned property" or "lost property."

"It is my understanding that they are entitled to all the money if it is ruled as abandoned property," Greenfield said, "and to 10 per cent if it is declared

lost property and it is restored to the loser."

"Of course," he added, "heirs may claim it."

Ella Beardsley, the spinster who once lived on the land, is survived by nine nieces and nephews.

Miss Beardsley was killed seven years ago at the age of 89. She left an estate totaling \$40,000, including about \$17,000 in cash found secreted in her house.

The house and a garage have long since been cleared off the land, which is now owned by John Rosenbeck, a Bayard farmer.

## Questions Raised by Moneys, Credits Repeal

DES MOINES (AP)—The Iowa Legislature apparently is not through with the bill it passed to repeal five mills of the moneys and credits tax.

Gov. Harold Hughes said Wednesday that because of the form in which action was completed the measure might jeopardize the bond-issuing capacity of Iowa schools and local governments.

He suggested that Democrat leaders recall the bill from him and rewrite it to eliminate questions that have been raised.

The measure left in force one mill of the present six-mill tax because it is pledged for retirement of the Korean veterans bonus bonds.

Hughes said he was not convinced that doubts about the form of the bill were justified but it would be "better to run the bill through the Assembly again" than to leave it open to possible court challenges.

Questions about it were raised by Blythe C. Conn, an official of

the Iowa Association of School Boards. He said he had been contacted by fearful school board officials in Des Moines, Cedar Rapids and other large cities.

Conn said they were afraid the legislature may have unintentionally eliminated the Korean bonus levy, throwing it back on general property taxpayers, and prejudiced the "marketability of bonds" issued by local governing bodies.
