

Kuemper Wins Loop Title in Win at Jeff; Eagles Beat Tigers

KHS Hosts Dodgers on Wednesday

JEFFERSON — The defending champion Kuemper Knights clinched the West Central baseball league crown with a 2-0 victory over Jefferson here Monday night.

It was the 14th consecutive league win without a setback for Coach Dick Tighe's crew, and the win mathematically eliminated runner-up Breda. The Bobcats picked up their 11th win with a 3-0 nod over Manning but are three down in the loss column with only two left to play.

Louie Billmeier blanked the Rams on a nifty three hitter while a pair of Jefferson errors and a run-scoring single by Ernie Golwitzer gave the Knights the necessary margin in the fifth.

Kuemper returns home on Wednesday to attempt to avenge the long setback of the season as the Red and Gold hosts Fort Dodge High in Carroll Stadium at 8 p.m. The Dodgers are undefeated and

tuned up for the non-loop affair in Carroll with a 12-0 romp past Jefferson last Friday as they pounded out 17 hits off Tom Lawson.

In a previous game at Fort Dodge, earlier in the season, the Dodgers posted a 7-4 triumph over the Knights.

Jefferson's Lawson held the Knights in check over the first four frames here Monday despite jams in the first, third and fourth innings. Kent Casey doubled with one away in the first but was stranded by Ernie Golwitzer's whiff and a pop to short by Billmeier.

Tom Louis singled in the third and Frankie Golwitzer hit into a fielder's choice and then moved to second on an error before Casey popped out.

Billmeier got on via a fielder's choice in the fifth after Ernie Golwitzer had been safe on an error. A stolen base put Billmeier on second and he moved to third on Rollie Kitt's single, but Kelly had been a whiff victim and Dave Staiert fanned.

The Kuemper margin came on a two-out rally in the top of the fifth. Frankie Golwitzer was safe on an error and stole second. Casey grounded to short

and was safe on the error and continued to second when Golwitzer streaked around third and beat the throw to the plate.

Ernie Golwitzer lined a single to right field and Casey scored from second base as the Jefferson first baseman cut off the throw to the plate.

Jefferson tried to storm back in the bottom of the fifth. With one away Durlam walked and moved to third on Lawson's long double. Raaz was retired on a pop for the second out.

Kuemper's Ernie Golwitzer saved the game with a sensational one-handed catch in deep center field on Roger Carlson's long poke to account for the third out and leave two Rams stranded.

The Rams were not able to get a runner beyond second at any other time. In the second inning, Charlie Porter singled and stole second but was left standing by two successive grounders to third. That accounted for a pair of the five assists credited to third baseman Leo Colison.

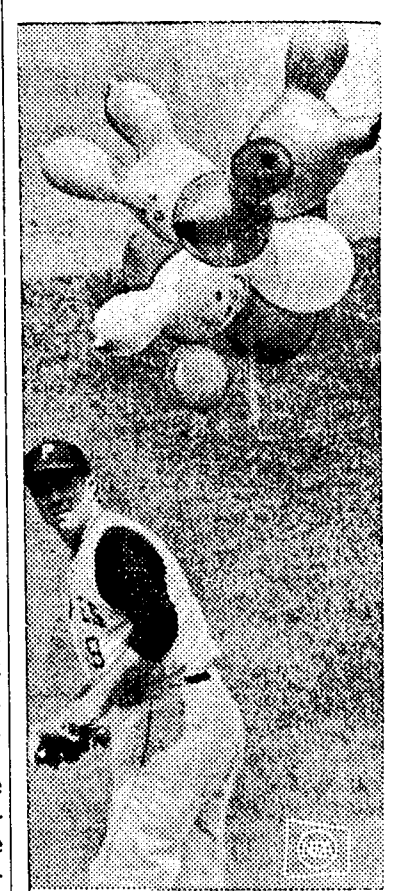
Carlson singled for the Rams in the third and got to second on an error but died as Bob Beyer fanned. An infield error and a passed ball put Erik Olsen on second in the fourth, but he was thrown out at third on a fielder's choice. The final Jeff threat came in the seventh when Lazier walked with two away. Lawson grounded to short and Kitt picked up his fourth assist on an inning-ending toss to second.

Lake City Posts 2nd Win, 15-10

The Lake City Eagles unleashed a 16-hit attack and outlasted Carroll 15-10 in a prep league baseball game here Monday night.

The victory enabled the Eagles to gain a tie for eighth with Audubon on identical 2-11 records while the Tigers absorbed their ninth setback in 13 outings.

In other action around the West Central league, Breda pinned a 3-0 loss on Manning; Perry overwhelmed Audubon, 14-4; and Kuemper retained the league championship with a 2-0 nod over Jefferson.

Lake City jumped off to a four run lead against Carroll in the second inning. It started with a single by Morgan and was followed by a two-base error in right field on Joe Newland's poke. Redenius and Willis put together back to back singles before Willis was thrown out at second for the first out of the frame.

Denny Newland lived on an error at first and Bill Goodyear singled before Lee grounded to the mound. Hoover picked up the second of three consecutive hits, but Fell ended the uprising with a fly to second.

The Eagles got six more in the top of the third to take a 10-0 lead. With one down, Joe Newland, Redenius and Willis singled consecutively. Denny Newland was safe on an error, Goodyear lived on a similar miscue, but Lee broke the base-running string with a strike out. Hoover singled again and Fell was safe on a two-base error as Hoover scored. Morgan ended that threat with a ground out.

Carroll battled back in the bottom of the third with four runs and escaped the 10-run rule that would have ended it after five frames. Scott Richardson and Tom Dryden were safe on errors, and Terry Wenck came through with a timely single. Mark Baudler followed with another single. After Denny Wilkins fanned, Doug Ohde grounded to second.

Gary Sundermann was safe on an error at first as the fourth run was plated, but Tom Subbert was thrown out from short to first to retire the side.

The Eagles picked up an insurance run in the fourth on a double by Tom Willis and a single by Denny Newland.

Carroll came back with one in the fifth when Ohde singled and moved up as Sundermann was safe on an error and Subbert walked. A passed ball plated Ohde.

The Tigers rallied for three in the sixth. Dryden walked and Wenck singled. Wild pitches moved the base runners around and they both scored on errors at the plate. With two down, Wilkins singled and moved up when Ohde was safe on an error and scored on Sundermann's single.

Lake City put it away with four more in the seventh. A walk to Lee, a double by Hoover, a walk to Fell and a double by Morgan brought in three and Joe Newland's single tallied the fourth.

Carroll struck back in the bottom of the seventh when Richardson walked. Dryden got on with a fielder's choice. Wenck drew a pass as did Steve Stroh and Wilkins doubled a pair home.

Next action for the Tigers will be at Denison on Wednesday.

Chisox and Tribe Share First Place

The Chicago White Sox scored 17 runs.

That's right. The Go-Go White Sox — speedy, pitching-rich and defense-minded — scored 17 runs. And in one game.

That total, which matched their entire scoring output for the previous week, was amassed with a 19-hit attack that included three homers, one a grand slam.

And it carried the White Sox over Minnesota 17-4 and into a share of the American League lead. Cleveland's rampaging Indians also grabbed a piece of first place with their 15th victory in the last 17 games, a 9-2 romp over Boston.

Chicago and Cleveland now have a one-half game edge on Minnesota, out of the league

lead for the first time since May 20.

In other AL action — the Detroit Tigers nipped Baltimore 4-3 and the New York Yankees stretched their winning string to five by beating Washington twice, 3-0 on Mel Stottlemyre's two-hit pitching and 4-3.

In the National League — Juan Marichal of San Francisco shut out the Los Angeles Dodgers 5-0, New York's last-place Mets swept a doubleheader from Milwaukee, 5-2 and 6-3, Pittsburgh shaded Cincinnati 5-4, Philadelphia beat St. Louis 3-0, and Chicago defeated Houston 7-2.

Dave Boswell of the Twins had checked the White Sox on one hit and had a 3-0 lead when the uprising started in the fifth inning. Chicago loaded the bases on singles by Ken Berry and Al Weis and a walk to J.C. Martin, then McCraw blasted his 420-foot grand slam.

Jimmie Hall tied it for Minnesota with a homer in the last of the inning, but in the sixth the White Sox really cut loose. Danny Cater and John Romano belted homers off Boswell and Chicago collected five more runs in the inning.
