

Tigers Split With Denison

DENISON — A seventh inning run-scoring double by Phil Den Adel gave Carroll a 7-6 edge over the Denison Monarchs in the second game of a double-header here Wednesday night. The third-place Monarchs won the first contest, 4-1, on Craig Johnson's three-run homer in the fifth inning.

Bob Lingle, Denison's lanky fireballer checked the Tigers on three hits in the first game and was tagged for only two in his four inning stint in the second game.

Carroll got off to an early lead in the first game. Back-to-back singles by Den Adel and Jim Schrad set the stage for the first run of the game. Pinch hitter Jay Corbett went down on strikes and was followed by Paul Bruns who smacked a long drive over third base which bounced over the fence for an automatic double bringing in Den Adel. Scott Richardson took three strikes to retire the side.

Both teams went scoreless in the third frame but Denison came back in the fourth with a run. Successive singles by Larry Cose, Mike Miller, and Bob Bluml plus an error by the

right fielder gave Denison a run and tied the score at one apiece.

The Monarchs charged back again in the fifth adding three runs to their total. Steve Skarin led off for Denison with a single to right. Howard Henningson drew a pass to first and was followed by hefty Craig Johnson, who smashed a home run over the left - center field fence giving the Monarchs a 4-1 edge.

Lingle struck out the next three Carroll batters in the bottom of the fifth saving the three run advantage and ending the first game of the duel with a score of 4-1 for Denison.

Carroll jumped to an early lead again in the second game picking up two runs in the second inning. Den Adel led off for the Tigers with a liner up to the keyhole. Bruce Hall's sacrifice to the pitcher put Den Adel on second, and Mickey Everett's grounder to shortstop placed Den Adel in position to score. Scott Richardson tapped a short one to right to bring both runners in.

Denison again tied up the game in the fourth inning as they had in the previous contest. Triples by Jim Lindstrom and John Sharp were the chief gainers for the Monarchs. Lindstrom led off for Denison with a long drive to right-center and managed to stretch it into an inside the park home run on an error. Cose grounded to short

and was followed by Miller who popped to the same position. Sharp smashed a long triple to center and was brought in on Dick Neumann's drive through the keyhole.

Both teams added four runs to their scores in the fifth frame forcing extra innings to the game. Jay Corbett led off for the Tigers with a walk. Richardson's shot to second was fumbled allowing both runners safe. Singles by Schrad and Bruns brought in two runs and errors by Denison allowed two more safely across the plate.

Denison charged back in the bottom half of the fifth with four runs. Lingle led off for the Monarchs with a double to center. Lingle was advanced to scoring position by Henningson's tap to left. An error on the second baseman put Johnson on first and Lindstrom's second three-bagger of the game brought around three runners. Another error on the Carroll second baseman allowed Lindstrom in safe.

The Tigers gained the advantage in the seventh frame. Wilkins reached first with a base on balls. Den Adel's hard shot over third brought Wilkins around giving Carroll a 7-6 edge.

Denison threatened in the bottom of the seventh but

couldn't mount enough steam to tie up the score.

The Tigers conclude their regular season's play Saturday against Kuemper.

Elsewhere around the league, Breda tripped Jefferson twice, 3-2 and 2-1, and dropped the Rams into third place in the standings behind Perry.

The Perry Bluejays hiked their league mark to 10-5 with a pair of wins over Manning, 15-0 and 13-1.

Audubon forged a fourth-place tie with Denison on the strength of two wins over Lake City, 6-1 and 7-6.

Breda rallied in the fifth frame of the first game to overcome a 2-1 Jefferson lead. Polking led off with a single and Timmerman and Stork drew passes. Steinkamp grounded to the infield and Polking was out at the plate, but Steinkamp made it to first and Ortnor's base hit drove in the tie run and winning marker.

Danny Diddy pitched a perfect game for Perry in the 15-0 win over Manning, and Denny Pennington hurled a one-hitter for the 13-1 victory. The Bluejays came up with 10 hits in each encounter.

Francis Madsen hurled a five-hitter for Audubon in the 6-1 victory over Lake City and started the second game but had to be rescued in the third by Kirk McLaughlin.

KHS Win Streak Cut by Dodgers

Fort Dodge snapped Kuemper's 14-game winning streak, 8-2, with four - run explosions in the first and sixth innings here Wednesday night in a non-league encounter.

Jim Middendorf, the Kuemper freshman who hurled creditably the night before against Denison, was a surprise starter for the Knights and ran head-long into the first inning uprising.

The Dodgers greeted Middendorf with a pair of hits by Larry Castagnoli and Del Blankenhagen and Major Greig lived on an error to load the sacks with none down.

Gary Bellingtier lined a hit to right and two runs scored and that signalled Middendorf's departure in favor of Denny Bellinghausen.

Bruce Johnston greeted Bellinghausen with a double to plate two more, but the young Kuemper relief hurler buckled down and got Vic Gordon on a grounder, fanned Don Yeager and induced Jose Grady to ground out to retire the side.

The Dodgers mounted a threat in the second when pitcher Chuck Blankenhagen got the first of his three successive hits and Castagnoli followed with a double. Del Blankenhagen fanned for the first out and Greig hit into a sharp double play from short to first to home to get Chuck Blankenhagen trying to score on the ground-out.

Kuemper had a threat going in the bottom of the second when Larry Pirotte led off with a single and Kent Casey walked with one down, but Casey was picked off first for the second out and Tom Louis stranded Pirotte with a whiff.

The Knights broke through in the fourth when Louie Billmeier led off with an infield hit and Pirotte drew a pass. After Keat and Casey fanned, Tom Louis singled to left to plate Billmeier, but Dave Daeges whiffed to end that rally.

Bellinghausen ran into trouble in the sixth with one down. He passed Yeager and was touched for an infield hit by Grady. Blankenhagen tripled to right and two more runs were across the plate.

After Castagnoli grounded out, Del Blankenhagen was safe on an error as another run scored. Greig singled past second and Bellingtier lined a shot to right to plate Del Blankenhagen, but

Greig was caught trying to reach third to retire the side. Kuemper bounced back in the bottom of the sixth when Pirotte led off with a hit but was forced by Keat who in turn was forced by Casey.

Louis doubled to left to plate Casey, but Daeges tapped to the mound to end the rally.

The Knights had a short-lived rally with two down in the seventh when Dave Schmitz singled to right, but Billmeier went down on strikes to end the affair.

The setback left the Knights with a 14-1 season record and a 13-0 mark in the West Central league where they won the crown when Jefferson, the last remaining challenger, was mathematically eliminated by Breda.

Kuemper will wind up the regular season with Breda here Friday and a return engagement with the Carroll Tigers on Saturday.
