Brechler Chalks Up 15 Strikeouts

LAKE CITY — Pitching ace Steve Brechler came through again with his second consecutive three-hitter of the season as the Carroll Tigers boosted their league record to 3-1 on a romp past the Lake City Eagles, 9-2, here Monday night.

Lanesboro Horse Show Great Success

The horse show at Lanesboro, after two postponements, was given Sunday, June 9, by Roy King and Ray Broch, sponsors and producers, who donated all of their time.

The total of receipts for the Leanna Prill Fund was \$165.98. Many horsemen were present and donated their time and skill. Mayor Merle Jenkins was present and handled the financial end of the event and donated his time.

The youthful Tiger ballclub drilled Eagle hurler Mike Rensburg for eleven hits over the seven inning stretch, but Rensburg held for reciprocal treatment as he struck out eleven Carroll batters. Carroll pitcher Brechler fanned a total of fifteen Lake City batters.

Mark Baudler led the Carroll hitting parade with a double and a pair of singles in three official times at bat. Scott Richardson also smashed a double for the Tigers, and Bill Albright chipped in a two-bagger for the Eagles.

The Eagles drew first blood in the contest with a run in the bottom of the second inning. Blair Redenius caused the damage reaching first on an error and advancing to home plate on Don Kelley's hit and an in-field error on the Tigers.

Carroll went on the attack in the top of the third with a six run outburst. Dave Henning led off for the Tigers with a base on balls. Mick Everett, Baudler, Brechler, Richardson, and Roger Fuller combined to tag Lake City pitcher Rensburg for five straight singles bringing four runners across the plate in rapid succession. Fuller rode in on a steal, while Denny Vetter came across on Ken Kieck's sacrifice.

The Eagles tallied another run in the bottom of the third on a double by Albright and a pair of singles by Bill Meinen and Blair Redenius.

The sixth frame showed two more runs for the Carroll

cause. Kieck led off with a single and advanced on Tom Jones' sacrifice. Everett singled in the run and advanced on a pitcher's error. Baudler sacrificed Everett to the plate for the eighth run.

Scott Richardson tallied the final run for the Tigers in the top of the seventh. The Carroll catcher opened things with a double, Roger Fuller followed with a walk putting Richardson on second. The speedy Richardson did the rest as Dave Baumhover fell victim to strikes and Ken Kieck popped to second. The final score of the game was Carroll-9, Lake City-2.

The Tigers will host the Perry Bluejays here Wednesday night at 8 p.m. at Carroll Stadium.

KHS Wiped Out By Triple Play

Perry snuffed out a last ditch Kuemper rally with a swift triple play and preserved a fourth-hit 3-0 shutout for Dan Diddy here Monday night.

It was the first loop setback of the season for the Knights and can be attributed to shoddy defense and anemic hitting.

Denny Bellinghausen worked the first six frames on the mound for the Knights and deserved a better fate. He gave up four hits and two of those were fly balls either lost in the lights or misjudged.

Kuemper's weak hitting had produced only two safeties in the first six frames and Coach Lou Gaketich went to the bench in the bottom of the seventh with a three-run deficit.

Scott Schmitz started the Kuemper rally with a line single to left. Doug Staiert, another pinch-hitter, followed with a hit to deep short.

With runners on first and second, and none down, Jim Middendorf came to the plate. Middendorf hit a Diddy pitch on the nose, but it was a line shot to Doug Kinder at third base. Kinder fired to Jim Seely at second to double up Schmitz, and Seely whipped the ball to Ron Pennington at first to get Staiert and complete the triple play that ended the game with decisive quickness.

Perry's first two runs were unearned. With one down, Bob Heisler was safe on an error. Bruce Klein forced Heisler at second. Pennington drew the only pass issued by Bellinghausen and there were runners on first and second with two down.

Doug Kinder's routine grounder to short skipped into left field and Klein scored on the boot and Pennington wound up on third. Then a passed ball scored Pennington.

The Kuemper defense fell apart again in the fourth, but Bellinghausen extricated himself by taking over the fielding chores as well as the mound efforts. In the six frames he worked on the hill, he handled 10 chances and was charged with one error and credited with nine assists.

Perry got a threat going in the fourth when Heisler was safe on an error at second with one down. A stolen base put the runner on second. Klein grounded to second and the Lancer second-sacker elected to go to third for the lead runner. His throw had Heisler nailed, but the ball trickled out of the third sacker's glove in making the tag.

Klein stole second to keep the pressure on. Pennington bounced a chopper to Bellinghausen's left and it skipped off his glove to Dick Heithoff at second and he threw the batter out as the runners held. Then Kinder grounded to the mound to end the frame.

Perry tallied another run on three safeties in the sixth. Heisler singled with one down but in turn was cut down on an attempted theft. Klein singled to center and took second on a wild pitch. Pennington lofted a high pop back of second and three Kuemper defenders converged in a diminishing triangle and watched the ball drop for a two-base hit that plated Klein.

Jim Middendorf worked the final frame for the Knights

and gave up a two-out single to Seely but got Stan Groat on a tap to the mound for the third out.

Kuemper's first hit was recorded by Ron Friedman with a lead-off single to center in the second. He went to second on a wild pitch but was stranded as Lynn Wiese, Denny Walden and Mark Wiedenfeld became successive strike-out victims.

The next Lancer threat came in the third when Bellinghausen led off with a single to center and stole second. Dave Daeges coaxed a pass, but Dick Heithoff whiffed. Rick Goins shot a grounder to third and was safe on a fielder's choice as the third baseman lost the handle as he attempted the force at third.

With the sacks jammed, and one out, Joe Badding and Friedman went down on strikes to retire the side.

The Knights didn't have another serious threat until the seventh when the triple play wiped them out.

Kuemper will be in action in a twilighter Tuesday at Fort Dodge with Randy Lengeling the likely starter. On Wednesday it will be Jim Middendorf on the mound at Denison. The Knights return home on Thursday to host Paton-Churdan with Lynn Wiese a probable hurler, and on Friday Kuemper hosts Carroll with Bellinghausen the probable choice.
