# Tigers Whip Jeff, 7-1

JEFFERSON — Carroll High's baseball miseries of the past took an optimistic turn for the better here Monday night, as the Tigers trampled the Jefferson Rams, 7-1, in their league opener, under the brilliant no-hit pitching of sophomore hurler, Steve Brechler.

Brechler, a lanky, hard-throwing southpaw, celebrated his debut in the Tiger baseball ranks by neatly disposing of 10 Ram batters on strikeouts and allowing only one run across the plate on a bases full walk. Brechler also led the Bengals in the hitting department with a pair of singles.

The Carroll club picked up the bulk of their runs in the second inning with a five-run burst. Jeff Beneke started things off for the Tigers reaching first base on an error. Roger Fuller followed suit climbing onto the first sack on a shortstop error. Denny Vetter's sacrifice bunt went untouched loading the bases.

Ken Kieck slapped a

grounder to right, but an error sent Kieck around to second and brought two runners across the plate. Bruce Pettitt drew a pass to first and advanced to second on Mick Everett's fielder's choice, which nailed Vetter at home plate. Marc Baudler sacrificed and Brechler followed with a single that brought two more runners home free. Scott Richardson hit into a fielder's choice to retire the side.

Neither team could mount a threat in the third and fourth frames, but Carroll came back in the fifth inning to add two more cushion runs.

Richardson led off for the Bengals with a line drive over third base. Beneke and Fuller fell victim to strikes, but Richardson took the initiative stealing two bases under the noses of the Jefferson battery. Vetter reached first on a pass and was followed by Kieck who again reached base on an error scoring Richardson and Vetter. Pettitt popped to the catcher to end the side.

Jefferson sneaked into the scoring column in the bottom of the sixth inning. Carroll pitcher, Brechler, suffering problems with his control, allowed three successive batters to reach first on balls.

With the bases loaded, a wild pitch sent Jim Faaborg of Jefferson scampering to home plate safely for the home run of the evening for the Rams.

The Tigers will host St. Bernard's of Breda in Carroll stadium Wednesday at 8 p.m.

## 5-Furlong Feature at Ak-Sar-Ben

OMAHA — Two year-olds will be spotlighted this week at Ak-Sar-Ben as the 46-day race meeting passes the halfway point.

The \$10,000 Freshmen Purse, a five-furlong scamper, heads Thursday's twilight card. Among the top candidates are Cherry Lake, owned by R. D. Beren, and Rebel Roan, owned by B. R. Evans. Cherry Lake has won two races here this year while Rebel Roan won the \$10,000 Sponsors' Purse earlier this year.

Other top candidates include Tin Horn and Marti Marti, owned by Claude Cowan and trained by John Cheeneey, Lynlero and Meabird.

There are 60 still eligible for Friday's \$10,000-added Ak-Sar-Ben Lassie Stakes, a five-furlong dash for two-year-old Nebraska-bred fillies.

Saturday will be highlighted by the \$15,000-added J. E. Davidson Memorial Handicap for three-year-olds and up at six furlongs.

The Ak-Sar-Ben mutual handle record was broken during last week's Memorial Day card. A crowd of 24,537 wagered \$1,320,402 to break the record of \$1,288,938 set June 24, 1967.

Don Lewis leads L. J. Duroseau by 9 points in the race for the jockey championship. Lewis has ridden 26 winners en route to 194 points. Duroseau has 185 points.

Jack Van Berg of Columbus had 4 winners last week to gain the lead in the trainers race. Van Berg, the perennial champion has recorded 10 wins, 6 seconds, and 7 thirds for 79 points.

## Veterans Boost L.A., Cards Win

 The Ken Boyer-Rocky Colavito entry, out of the money a year ago in Chicago, is beginning to pay its way for the Los Angeles Dodgers.

Boyer and Colavito, the aging sluggers obtained by the Dodgers this spring in separate deals with the Chicago White Sox, delivered successive run-scoring singles in the first inning Monday night, triggering Los Angeles to a 2-0 victory over Pittsburgh.

Staked to the early lead, southpaw Claude Osteen scattered seven hits and blanked the Pirates with the help of four double plays.

The National League leading St. Louis Cardinals drubbed Houston 7-2 for their sixth consecutive victory; Atlanta grabbed second place by edging Cincinnati 3-2 and Philadelphia nipped San Francisco 1-0 in other games. The Chicago Cubs and New York Mets were idle.

In the American League, Cleveland beat the White Sox 3-2 in 14 innings, Boston beat Detroit 4-3, Minnesota edged New York 4-3, and Baltimore topped California 2-0. Oakland and Washington were not scheduled.

The Dodgers purchased Colavito, 34, shortly before the start of the season and signed Boyer, 37, as a free agent last month in an effort to beef up their attack. The White Sox picked up both veterans last season for the same reason, but could finish no better than fourth—although the pair combined to drive in 50 runs.

Monday night, Boyer hiked his batting average 25 points to .304 with a double and the RBI single in three trips to the plate. Colavito, 1-for-3 against the Pirates, moved up four points to an even .200. The Dodgers, meanwhile, returned to the .500 level and remained only 3½ games off the lead.

Osteen, who struck out six, brought his record to 4-7 at the expense of Pirate southpaw Bob Veale, 2-6, who has been given a total of eight runs to work with in his six setbacks.

Mike Shannon drove in three runs with two doubles and a sacrifice fly and Orlando Cepeda delivered two more with a single and his sixth homer as the Cardinals held first place by one game over Atlanta.
