

Jeff Drops Tigers Out of 1st Division, 7-0

Everett Collects 2 of 3 CHS Hits

Weak hitting and costly throwing errors put the damper on Carroll's efforts here Wednesday night as the Tigers dropped a 7-0 decision to the Jefferson Rams and dropped out of the first division in league standings.

It was the fourth straight setback for the Bengals who rattled the Rams, 7-1, in their season's opener behind the no-hit pitching of Steve Brehler.

The Tigers managed only three hits off Jefferson's righthander, Jim Faaborg.

Mick Everett came through with two solid hits for Carroll, while reserve first baseman Jim DeBower chipped in the other one-bagger. Jefferson's Dave Carlson was the big stick on his club with a single, double, and an inside the park home run. Carlson chalked up three runs batted in.

Jefferson jumped to a lead early in the first inning on singles by Carlson and Faaborg, and a double by Kevin Wand.

The Tigers tried to even up the score in the bottom of the first after Everett cracked a single into center and stole second. Marc Baudler and Scott Richardson fell victim to strikes, and Brehler's smack to left was pulled down, leaving Everett stranded.

The Rams didn't let up on the steam in the second frame, but some costly Carroll errors did most of the damage. Tom Lynch led off with a teaser that didn't quite make it to short. Steve Hastings hit into a fielder's choice, but an errant throw to first base saved him and gave both runners an extra base. A throwing error on the Carroll catcher brought Lynch across and moved Hastings to third.

Dan Borrusch tapped a liner to center that skipped between the centerfielder's feet and allowed Hastings to come in safely while placing Borrusch on second base. Bob Zeller flew out to left field, but Carlson cracked a two-bagger over third base to score Borrusch for the fourth Jefferson run.

The Tigers again managed to mount an unsuccessful threat in the bottom of the second. Jeff Beneke reached first with a base on balls. Consecutive ground-outs by Roger Fuller and Denny Vetter moved Beneke into scoring position at third, but Ken Kieck flew out to center to end the side.

Carroll errors in the fourth frame gave the Rams another run to their tally. Hastings led off reaching first on an error by the Carroll third baseman. Hastings stole second, but Borrusch was walked. A wild pitch moved both runners ahead. Zeller tapped a grounder to third, but the throw to home plate for the put-out attempt went high and Hastings scored safely. Carlson hit into a second fielder's choice, but this time the throw to home from third was true and Borrusch was nailed for the out. Moments later Zeller broke for home on a loose ball, but a toss from Richardson to Dave Henning, the second Carroll pitcher of the evening, replacing Roger Fuller, doomed Zeller at the plate.

Carroll went five straight hitless innings, but the Rams added two more cushion runs in the top of the sixth frame.

Once again a Carroll error started things off for Jefferson as Zeller reached first on a shortstop error. A throwing error from the plate sent Zeller to second unopposed.

Carlson stepped up next in the batting order and responded with a hard smash over third base line up to the left field fence. The Carroll left fielder couldn't seem to locate the ball and Carlson sped around the bases with an inside the park, two-run homer.

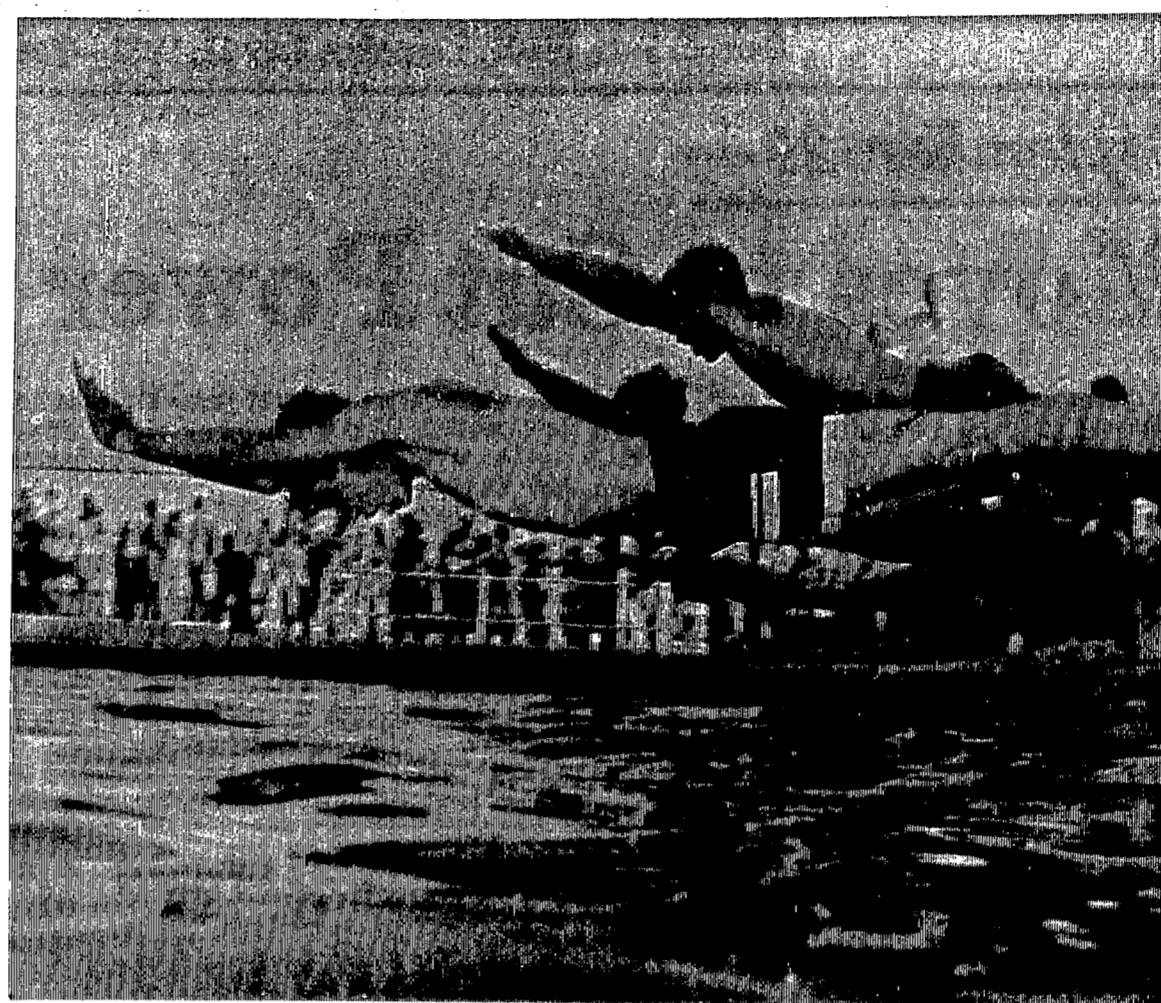

GLIDDEN — The undefeated Glidden swim team splashed in to undisputed first place in the Iowa West Conference standings with a 227-173 victory over previously unbeaten Manning here Wednesday night.

Nine pool records fell by the wayside as the Wildcats overcome a two-point deficit at the end of individual events in a fiercely contested dual meet.

Down 145-143 at the end of the individual events, the Glidden swimmers swamped the visitors by a 12-4 margin in the relays.

At the end of the first four medley relays, the Wildcats still trailed by two, 157-159, when the meet turned in the girls 13-14 age group on a disqualification of Manning's first place finishers. That hike d Glidden into a 164-159 edge and the Wildcats were never headed as they chalked up their fifth straight win.

Top individual honors went to Manning's Marg Stangl with a triple win in the 15 and over age group. She won the back crawl in :20.2, breast stroke in :23.3 and tied for first with Glidden's Nancy Shaner in the butterfly in a record breaking :17.5 photo finish.
