

Knights Blank Perry, 2-0; Tigers Lose, 6-3

Lengeling's 4th Shut-Out, 5th Win

PERRY — Randy Lengeling, Kuemper's stellar right hander, hurled a brilliant one-hit shut-out as the Knights took a strange hold on first place in the eastern division of the Mid-West conference baseball league with a 2-0 win over Perry here Wednesday.

It was Lengeling's fourth shut-out and fifth win on the season. The lanky Kuemper hurler kept his earned run mark unblemished and fanned nine over the seven inning route.

Mike Murphy, the Perry hurler, nearly matched Lengeling's performance with a two-hitter and neither hit figured in Kuemper's two-run scoring burst in the sixth frame.

Murphy's support wavered in the fatal sixth and two errors cost him the game.

The only hits off Murphy were by Jerry Hermesen with a broken-bat grounder to short in the first and a pop-up back of second base by Don Baldus in the seventh. Baldus was credited with a hit when Perry's bewildered second baseman lost the ball in the lights.

The lone hit off Lengeling

was a booming triple to right field by Mike Bristle with one down and nobody aboard in the fourth. Lengeling worked out of that jam by fanning Joe Connors and Gary Darveaux.

It was Kuemper's ninth win on the season against one loss and it gave the Knights a 6-0 mark in loop play.

The first Kuemper threat came in the first frame when Hermesen beat out the infield dribbler with one down. But Murphy got Rich Golwitzer on strikes and Bill Henkenius on a tap to the mound to choke that threat.

Perry got two aboard in the first but couldn't cash a run. Murphy was safe at first when Lengeling dropped a toss from first baseman Henkenius while covering first for an attempted put-out. Jeff Miner fanned for the second out in the frame, but Bristle walked. Then Connors whiffed to strand two baserunners.

In the third, the Knights got Don Baldus on base via the error route with two down, but Hermesen popped to third.

The Bluejays went down in order in the second and third and then posed the big threat in the fourth on Bristle's one-out triple that sailed over Golwitzer's head in right.

The Knights threatened to break the scoreless deadlock in the fifth when Pat Riddle was safe on an error by the third baseman with one away. Dan Schmitz grounded to second and

Riddle was forced. Schmitz lived on the fielder's choice but was stranded when Lengeling was robbed of a base hit in right. Lengeling's pop fly to short right was gloved by the rightfielder on a diving catch.

The sky caved in on Murphy in the sixth when Jerry Hermesen fanned with one away but lived on the catcher's error as the third strike caromed off the side of the mitt and sailed to the backstop. The speedy Hermesen made it safely to first and advanced to second when Golwitzer walked.

Henkenius chopped a grounder to the mound and was safe on a fielder's choice as Golwitzer was forced at second. Hermesen was perched on third and Henkenius stole second with Steve Auen at the plate.

Auen laced a grounder to the second baseman and was safe on an error when the throw to first was wide. Two runs scored on the miscue and Auen wound up on second where he was stranded when Jim Nurse fanned.

Kuemper threatened again in the seventh when Lengeling walked with two down and Baldus lived on the pop that fell behind second base. Hermesen grounded to the third base side of the mound and Murphy made a fine stop and throw to nail the Kuemper speedster at first.

Lengeling set the Bluejays down in order in the final three frames.

Next action for the Knights will be against Lake City in Carroll on Friday.

The Kuemper junior varsity

won a 6-4 decision in the opener with a comebacker behind spectacular relief pitching by Lon Dentlinger.

The big Kuemper side-armed with four runs in and one down in the first inning and hurled two-hit shut-out ball the rest of the way. The Kuemper JV squad now owns two wins and two ties on the season.

Rams Use 3 Hits And 7 Base Steals

The Carroll Tigers are learning how to lose baseball games the hard way. An invading crew of Jefferson Rams added to the Carroll woes here Wednesday evening by utilizing three base hits and some fancy base running to riddle the Tiger hopefuls, 6-3, in a Mid-West Conference, eastern division showdown.

The outcome was indicative of that phenomena of baseball which makes it both a game of skill and a game of chance. Carroll's pitching ace, Steve Brechler, held the Rams in check with only three hits, and whiffed 16 batters, while the Bengal batting order scattered six base hits. But the Jefferson club was a blur on the base paths, stealing seven bases, scrambling for extra bases, and outliving fielder's choices.

The Rams drew first blood in the top of the third frame with a two-run burst. Brechler put down Mike Wolterman on a called strike three for the first out in that inning, but issued a pass to Steve Little to open the door for the first Jefferson tally. Little stole second base and advanced to third on John Shanda's fielder's choice.

Shanda scampered to second with a stolen base and Brechler fired a wild pitch past Dan Murphy to score Little from third and advance Shanda to scoring position. Murphy rammed a run-scoring single up the middle and rounded to third on an error. Brechler fanned Dan Lehman and Jeff Raaz to end the threat.

The Tigers tied up the score in the bottom of the fourth inning on three base hits and a Jefferson error. Ron Anderson, Bruce Pettitt, and Brechler raped consecutive one-baggers through the keyhole. An error in center field was Anderson's green light for the first Carroll run and Brechler's line drive up the center scored Pettitt to tie the score at two apiece.

Jefferson charged back in the top of the fifth frame with a three-run outburst. Shanda drew a pass to start things for the Rams and advanced to second on a steal. Murphy slammed a double to left-center field to plate Shanda. Jeff Raaz kept the fire alive with a three-bagger up the right field line to score the fourth Jefferson tally. Tom Lynch tapped a dribbler midway to the mound, but Brechler could not find the handle and Raaz raced across the plate with fractions of seconds to spare.

Carroll threatened again in the bottom of the fifth inning. Wayne Hill got the Tigers started with a lead-off single down the third base stripe. Pinch-hitter, Bob Buadler, joined Hill on the sacks with a base on balls. Anderson nudged a sacrifice bunt to score Hill for the third and final Carroll run. Pettitt followed up with the second of his two base hits and Brechler loaded the sacks with a base on balls, but the three Tiger baserunners were stranded.

Jefferson added a cushion run in the top of the sixth

frame on some swift base-running by Wolterman, who drew a pass in the lead-off slot. Wolterman stole for second base and advanced to third on Shanda's fielder's choice. Shanda's tap to the mound appeared to be an easy out for the Tigers, but Brechler's throw-out to first went wide of its mark and Wolterman took off for paydirt unmolested.

Two strikeouts and a ground-out to second base was the story for both teams in the final frame, and the score settled at a precarious 6-3 margin for the Rams.

Carroll travels to Audubon on Friday evening for a non-division contest against the Wheelers. The game will begin at 8 p.m.
