

Knights Club Tigers 11-0 In 5 Inning Game

Kuemper's Randy Lengeling stymied the Carroll Tigers with a no-hitter while the Knights ran rampant in a five inning 11-0 win in the eastern division

of the Mid-West league here Monday night.

Kuemper utilized eight base hits, eight Tiger errors, 13 stolen bases, seven walks, two wild pitches and two passed balls to score the 11 runs.

The Knights will be back in action in league play here Wednesday with southpaw Bill Henkenius on the mound against Perry in a conference game. Kuemper is 2-0 in league play and 3-1 on the season.

Carroll's Steve Brechler was victimized by his mates in the first inning when the Knights tallied twice without benefit of a base hit.

Kuemper finally unlimbered the lumber with a pair of hits in a four-run fourth and added four more hits in a five run fifth.

Meantime, Lengeling tamed the Tigers with 11 strike-outs over the five frame route. The Kuemper fire-baller didn't permit a runner to reach base until the fourth. He registered six consecutive strike-outs while retiring the first nine in order.

Gary Lehrkamp broke the spell when he reached first on an error in the fourth. Lehrkamp went to second on a balk. After Bruce Pettitt fanned, Brechler walked and a passed ball advanced Brechler to second and Lehrkamp to third.

Lengeling buckled down and fanned clean-up hitter Roger Fuller for the second out in the frame and got Doug Peterson on strikes to quell the threat. In the last frame Plotz fouled to third and Baudler and Edwards each fanned.

Brechler deserved a better fate in the first. With one away, Jerry Hermesen lived on an er-

ror and stole second. But Jim Nurse popped out for the second out.

Bill Henkenius fanned for what should have been the third out. The third strike eluded the catcher, and Henkenius was safe at first on an errant throw as Hermesen sped home from second with the first run.

Henkenius stole second, and Pat Riddle was safe on an error as Henkenius scooted home.

After Riddle stole second, and third Rick Golwitzer and Dan Schmitz drew passes to load the sacks, but Steve Auen fanned.

The Knights had mild threats in the second on a one-out single and stolen base by Don Baldus and again in the third on a one-out double by Riddle but failed to cash either.

In the fourth, Lengeling led off and was hit by a pitch. Kasperbauer went in as a pinch runner and stole second and

third. After Don Baldus fanned, Hermesen walked and stole second.

Jim Nurse drove in two runs with a ringing double to left. Henkenius singled to center to score Nurse. Henkenius continued to third on an error on the play and scored on a passed ball as Riddle drew a walk. But Riddle strayed off first and was

caught in a run-down for the second out. Golwitzer walked, but Schmitz fanned to end the frame.

Steve Auen led off the fifth with an infield single and went to second on an errant throw. Lengeling dropped a bunt down the first base line and was safe as the pitcher bobbed the pick-up. Auen meantime had sped around third and Brechler's pick-off attempt sailed into the left field bull pen. That scored

Auen and put Lengeling on third.

Don Baldus tripled to center to plate Lengeling. Hermesen walked and stole second. Nurse singled to left to plate Baldus and later stole second.

With runners on second and third, Henkenius singled to left. Hermesen scored with ease, but Nurse was thrown out at the plate attempting to score from second. Henkenius wound up on second and went to third on a wild pitch. Riddle popped to

short for the second out in the inning.

Jim Baldus batted for Golwitzer and drove a high fly to left where the outfielder dropped the ball for a two-base error which scored Henkenius with the 11th Kuemper run. A passed ball put Jim Baldus on third, but Schmitz fanned to end the uprising.
