

Brechler, Henkenius Fan 17 Each—

Knights Nip Tigers 3-2 In 10 Frame Thriller

The Kuemper Knights nipped a scrappy crew of Carroll Tigers, 3-2, in a 10-inning marathon thriller here Thursday evening that witnessed one of the finest pitching duels of the 1970 baseball campaign.

The quarter final victory advances the Knights to the semifinals in sectional tournament play against the Denison Monarchs, who crushed Lake City, 11-3, in the opener of the twin bill. That game will get under way at 8 p.m. tonight at Carroll Stadium.

Kuemper hurler, Bill Henkenius, and Carroll's ace southpaw, Steve Brechler, treated local fans to a brilliant pitching exhibition

through the nine-inning deadlock in which the two clubs were tied up at two runs apiece. The two fastballers give up four hits each and fanned 17 batters each. In accordance with high school regulations, the two hurlers were retired after nine innings on the mound.

The Knights broke into an early lead in the ball game, carving an unearned run on the score board in the bottom of the opening frame. Don Baldus led off with a sharp crack to third base, but the throw to first was dropped to save the Kuemper left fielder. Baldus took second base on a steal, but Brechler

pinned strike-outs on Jerry Hermesen and Jim Baldus to put the pinch on Kuemper. Henkenius kept the Lancers alive with a line drive up the center to score Don Baldus for the first tally.

The Tigers could not buy a hit in the first two innings, while Kuemper padded their scant lead in the bottom of the second inning with another run. Jim Nurse led off with a base on balls and advanced to third on Pat Riddle's single to right field. An error on a throw from first base plated Nurse for the second Kuemper run.

Carroll charged back into the fray in the top of the fourth frame, forcing a 2-2 deadlock.

With two outs, Brechler and Doug Peterson stroked back-to-back singles to place Carroll in scoring position. Roger Fuller smacked a double into a hole in left-center field to score Brechler and Peterson for the 2-2 deadlock. Jim DeBower popped out to second base to retire the side.

Neither club could push a runner beyond second base during the next two frames, however, both teams mounted serious threats in a seventh inning, last ditch effort. Carroll's Fuller lived on an error in the top of that frame, but was cut down on

DeBower's fielder's choice. Peterson was a strike-out victim previous to Fuller, so the Tigers were in a corner with two away. Hill rapped a blooper into right to advance DeBower. A passed ball sent DeBower scampering to third for scoring position, but Randy Plotz whiffed for the final out.

The Knights threatened in similar fashion in the bottom half of that inning. With two outs, Don Baldus drew a pass and skipped around to third base on Hermesen's one-bagger through the keyhole. Brechler got himself out of the jam by striking out Henkenius for the final out.

The Bengals were dormant through the first two extra innings of play, while the Knights put two runners in scoring position in the eighth frame, loaded the sacks in the ninth, but could not mount the steam to push the needed run over home plate.

Kuemper finally broke through the stand-off in the tenth inning with their third unearned tally. Jim Nurse lived on an error at shortstop and scampered to second on a passed ball. Carroll relief hurler, Wayne Hill, surrendered a base hit to Riddle to advance Nurse to third base. Nurse took advantage of another passed ball to slide head first into home plate for the third Kuemper run.

Denison Racks Eagles, 11-3

The Denison Monarchs continued to run rough-shod over the opposition in the high school sectional baseball tournament with an 11-3 decision over Lake City here Thursday.

Coupled with a 10-0 win over Glidden-Ralston in the first round, the Monarchs will move into semi-final play against Kuemper here tonight at 8 p.m. with a season mark of 8-9 compared to Kuemper's 15-5 record.

Pitching apparently is the chief concern of Denison Coach Joel Franken and he used three hurlers against the Eagles on Thursday. Dave Grau, who worked five frames the previous night, went the first three. Randy Ulmer took over in the fourth for a three-inning stint, and Chip McGinn hurled the seventh.

Denison unloaded a 14-hit attack against Lake City's Mike Remsburg. Randy Waldron was the batting star for the Monarchs with three for four including a double and four runs batted-in.

The Monarchs got to Remsburg in the first inning with successive hits by Ed Fink, Grau and Waldron. Two runs came in on Waldron's poke, and a passed ball let in the third tally.

of the third for a pair of runs and tightened the score to 3-2. Dave Doty was hit by a pitch with two down. Bill Gregory lived on an infield hit and Rick Hucka singled to center to plate a pair.

Denison padded the margin with two more in the bottom of the third. A walk to Fink and a single by Grau set the stage for Waldron's two-run double.

With two down in the bottom of the fourth, Ulmer lived on an infield hit and went to second on an error and to third on a balk. He scored on Fink's liner past third.

The Monarchs put it out of reach with four more in the fifth. Doug Hanson singled to left and Denny Fineran was safe on an error. Ed Launderville's double scored Hanson and an infield hit by Tom Barnes plated Fineran. Launderville came in on an error and McGinn's sacrifice fly scored Barnes.

The Eagles got one run back against Ulmer in the sixth. Gregory led off with a hit to left and Hucka followed with a poke to right. Ed Newland's double downed the third baseline scored Gregory with Lake City's final run.

Ulmer worked out of the sixth inning jam by fanning Rems-

burg, getting Craig Heath to hit into a fielder's choice that got Hucka trapped between third and home and retiring Len Headlee on a fly to center. Denison's final run came in the sixth after Fink tripled to left and rode home on Grau's single.

The Eagles got two aboard against McGinn in the seventh on walks but couldn't muster a base hit.

Lake City finishes the season with a record of 9-8.
