

Kuemper Nips Paton-Churdan For 13-4 Mark

The Kuemper Knights utilized two-out seventh inning lightning to break a 2-2 tie and edge Paton-Churdan, 3-2, in a non-loop baseball game here Monday night.

The win hiked Kuemper's season record to 13-4. The Knights will be back in action here Thursday when they host Aurelia with a junior varsity contest at 6 p.m. and the varsity tilt at 8 p.m.

Bill Henkenius won his own game when he drilled a bases-loaded single past the second baseman and scored Lon Dentlinger from third with

the winning run. Kuemper's late-inning rally got underway when Dan Schmitz drew a pass to lead off. Dentlinger attempted a sacrifice and lived on an error as the catcher booted the soft bunt in front of the plate.

Don Baldus singled to left to load the sacks. With Jerry Hermens at the plate, the victors temporarily got fouled up in their strategy as Paton-Churdan Coach "Bill" Moore pulled his outfielders in close and drew the infielders in tight.

Kuemper attempted to retaliate with a squeeze, but Hermens missed the pitch and

Schmitz was trapped off third for the first out. With runners Rockets deployed to normal on first and second, the visiting depth and Hermens popped to short.

Jim Baldus kept the rally alive with a single to left and the bases were jammed again. Henkenius was down to his last strike when he smashed a vicious grounder past second to end the game.

Paton-Churdan got a gift run off the Kuemper left-hander, now 6-1 on the season, in the first. John Harmon got aboard via an infield

chopper that took a sharp bounce and Dean Fox followed with a line single to center that got through and allowed Harmon to come all the way home.

Kuemper got the upper hand with a two-run rally in the second. Jim Nurse started it when he drew a walk off lefthander Steve Happe with two down. Pat Riddle broke a batting slump with a double to center that plated Nurse with the tie run.

Dan Schmitz pickled a pitch into the left field corner and Riddle cruised home with the lead run.

The Knights stranded a pair in the third. Don Baldus led off with a walk but was forced by Rich Golwitzer. Henkenius kept the threat alive with a bloop bingle the second baseman couldn't handle, but Steve Auen went down on strikes to end the frame.

Paton-Churdan threatened in the fourth when the Kuemper defenses sprung a leak. With one down, Happe was safe at first when the first baseman and pitcher couldn't make the

proper connection on a loss to first.

Denny Tilley grounded to second, but Happe ploughed into Auen on the base path and was declared out for interference as the ball rolled into right field. The return throw was wide of third and Happe, who didn't realize he was out, set sail for home where he was nailed

again. While the meaningless play was being made at the plate, Tilley continued on to third where he was stranded when Al Thornton grounded to second.

Kuemper blew a run in the sixth. Auen singled past short and then was picked off first. Terry Kasperbauer followed with a double to left. He later

got to third on an errant pick off but stayed put as Riddle flied out.

Paton-Churdan tied it in the seventh when Thornton singled to right and John Vogel singled past third. They advanced on a passed ball. With one down, Jeff Trost

Tigers Rap Breda 8-3 For 4th In Row

BREDA — The Carroll Tigers stretched their winning streak to four games here Monday evening by romping past the Breda Bobcats of St. Bernard's High School, 8-3, in a non-loop clash.

Doug Peterson, a husky, sophomore fireballer, went the distance on the mound for the Tigers. Peterson surrendered six hits, seven walks, and fanned thirteen Breda batsmen. Glen Koster nearly matched Peterson's performance on the Breda side of the pitching sheet, giving up six Carroll hits, a pair of free passes, and eleven strike-outs.

Four unearned runs made the big difference for the Carroll club. The Breda defense was charged with six miscues, by comparison to Carroll's two

errors. But it was the Tigers who had to do the scrambling initially, after the Bobcats roared to a 3-0 lead in the first frame.

Glen Koster got the three-run rally underway with two outs by arching a three-bagger to right-center field. Ken Steinkamp followed with a double that plated Koster for the first tally. Joe Schwabe joined Steinkamp on the sacks with a single. Schwabe stole second base and both runners crossed the plate on Bob Polking's single.

The Tigers got into the scoring act in the third inning, tying up the score at three apiece. Gary Lehrkamp reached second base on a center field error. Ron Anderson walked, while Bruce Pettitt

lived on a fielder's choice that plated Lehrkamp. Peterson rapped a two-run single to tie the score.

Breda threatened in the fourth after Jerry Koster singled and advanced to second and third bases on a passed ball and a wild pitch, but the Breda power-hitters could not score Koster.

Carroll's Jim DeBower stretched a hit, a Breda miscue and passed ball into the fourth Tiger tally in the fourth frame. The Carroll team added two more runs in the fifth, again with DeBower's aid. Baudler rapped a single to get things underway. Peterson outlived an error and advanced to second base with a steal. DeBower cracked a two-bagger that plated the two runners and placed Carroll in the lead, 6-3.

The hapless Bobcats, who stranded twelve baserunners through the seven-inning stretch, threatened again in the fifth frame after Carroll's Peterson issued three consecutive passes to load the sacks. But the Bobcats executed two unsuccessful squeeze plays before Kennebeck was nailed at first base for the third out.

Carroll added a final pair of tallies in the sixth frame. Randy Plotz got things moving with a double and advanced on Lehrkamp's ground-out to first base. Anderson took a base on balls and stole second base. An errant pick-off throw from Breda pitcher sent both Tiger baserunners around the paths for the seventh and eighth runs.

The Tigers travel to Dow City Wednesday to re-challenge a ball club they trampled, 10-0, in Carroll Stadium on July 1.

Carroll meets the Dow City-Arion Greyhounds in an 8 p.m. contest.
