

Kasperbauer's Single Wins—

Kuemper Nips Jefferson, 4-3

Terry Kasperbauer's two-out single in the seventh inning scored Tom Gradoville to give Kuemper a come-from-behind 4-3 Midwest Conference victory over Jefferson Monday night at Carroll Stadium.

It was the third straight triumph for Lou Galetich's team after losing its first four games. Both teams now are 2-2 in league play behind Perry's 4-0 record.

Hits were hard to come by for the Knights, who were outby 5-3. Kuemper managed a single and a double in the first inning to score a run and didn't get another hit until Kasperbauer's game-winning blow.

Gradoville had reached base in the seventh off losing pitcher Chris Blackburn by walking. George Neil then laid down a perfect sacrifice bunt to get Gradoville to second. Kasperbauer then delivered.

It was an uphill battle for the Knights, who trailed 3-1 heading into the bottom of the sixth. Kuemper tied it, however, getting two runs on no hits, but

had the help of two walks, a pass ball, a wild pitch and a ground out.

After winning pitcher Dan Nurse and John Heithoff walked to start the inning, both moved up on a pass ball. Steve Garbier's ground out scored Nurse and a wild pitch by Blackburn brought home the tying run.

The Rams had scored two runs in the top of the sixth as Leo Brooker tripled and came home when catcher Mark Heithoff couldn't hold on to a throw. Greg Hand doubled, moved to third on a ground out and scored on a wild pitch for another run.

Both teams scored in the first inning. A single and an error got home the Jefferson run. Kuemper scored as Neil dou-

bled, moved to third on a wild pitch and came home on Phil Baldus' sacrifice fly.

Neither team threatened in the middle innings as Jefferson's starting pitcher Durbin and Kuemper's Nurse were both effective. Durbin allowed just two hits before being relieved in the sixth. Nurse went the distance on a five-hitter to pick up his first victory of the season after three setbacks.

Kuemper will try to make it four in a row, hosting Fort Dodge at 8 p.m. tonight. The Dodgers blanked the Knights, 2-0, on two hits earlier in the year. A junior varsity game will start at 6 p.m.

Eagles Victimize Tigers

LAKE CITY — A three-run spurt in the sixth inning powered the Lake City Eagles to their first win in seven starts, as they dumped the Carroll Tigers, 7-4 here Monday evening.

The Tiger loss plummeted them into a tie with the Eagles for last place in the Midwest Conference Eastern Division with identical league marks of 1-3.

The score stood tied at four apiece going into the bottom of the sixth, when Kevin Holm survived a treck to first on a throwing error from Tiger second baseman Bob Lehrkamp. Holm moved to second on a pass ball, while Bob Mally received a walk from Carroll pitcher Randy Plotz.

The sixth-inning fireworks began when Joel Yunek singled to left, pushing Holm in for the score, and advancing Mally to third. Left fielder Joe Dewey was next at the plate and singled in both Mally and Yunek for the insurance runs.

Carroll's biggest inning was the fifth when two runs scored on three hits, one a long double by Tiger catcher Bob Brown. Tom Nam led off the inning with a blooming single to shallow center. Ron Anderson bunted safely to push Nam to second.

Brown then stepped to the plate and cracked a shot deep into left-center, scoring both Nam and Anderson. Brown's blast was indeed a "long shot", as it finally came to rest at the fence surrounding the Lake City swimming pool.

But the Eagles too had a strong fifth inning as they scored two runs on three hits. Yunek, who was a thorn in the Tigers' side throughout the evening, led off with a sharp single to right-field and advanced to second on a single from Mike Fell. Yunek and Fell each stole bases putting runners on second and third, when catcher Larry McCaulley came to bat. McCaulley had been 0-2 at the plate, but singled in Fell after

Yunek had scored on a pass ball.

Carroll's second run came in the fourth inning when Plotz squeezed by McCaulley at the plate on a throw from Dewey. Plotz had gotten on base via a fielding error on Holm, and then advanced to second on a pass ball. Reggie Conrad popped a double into left field, which brought the Carroll pitcher scampering around the bases to be met at the plate by McCaulley. But the Eagle catcher missed the tag on Plotz, who literally went over the top of McCaulley.

The Tigers, now 2-6 overall, open the second round of league play Friday, June 23, when they meet cross-town rival Kuemper. The Tigers defeated Kuemper for the first time ever earlier this season. The Knights have won three in a row after losing their first four ball games.

Garbier's 73 Wins Local Tourney

Steve Garbier, Jon Rumfield and Jerry Dentlinger finished 1-2-3 respectively in the Independent Insurance Agents Association qualifying tournament at the Carroll Country Club Monday.

The three now advance to the state finals July 19 at the Echo Valley Country Club in Des Moines. The top five finishers in the state tournament will move on to the national tournament Aug. 3-4 at Wichita, Kan. At Wichita, the players will be paired with touring PGA players in a 72-hole pro-am.

Garbier finished with a three-over-par 73, coming home with a 37. Rumfield, who played on the Denison golf team this spring and who was sponsored in the tournament by the Denison Independent Insurance Agents Association, fired a 76 and Dentlinger, a 14-year-old, had a 77.

Two Kuemper varsity golfers took the fourth and fifth spots. Jeff Hunter got fourth at 78 and Steve Schulz fifth at 79. There

were 25 golfers in the meet, opened to boys between the age of 12 and 17.
