

# Homer Ruins Kuemper Bid

PERRY — Kuemper and Dan Nurse were one strike away from knocking off Midwest Conference Eastern Division leader Perry here Monday night.

**But Bluejay first baseman Mike Moyer ended the Knights hopes for a 1-0 nine inning victory by hammering a three-run homer over the right centerfield field wall.**

Moyer's winning blast gave Perry a 5-0 league record and gave them at least a share of the conference championship with only two games remaining.

Rick Henan and Nurse were locked up in a pitcher's duel through eight innings. To show how tough both were, Heenan allowed only one hit through the first seven innings and Nurse collared the Bluejays

on two hits through seven innings and retired the first 11 batters he faced.

Kuemper got its only run in the top of the ninth and it looked like it might stand up.

Terry Kasperbauer led off with a triple that Perry right fielder Tony Barnes lost in the lights. Nurse then blooped a single to make it 1-0. After one out, Steve Garbier got the fourth hit off Heenan, but Mark Heithoff struck out and Tom Gradoville was forced out to end the frame.

Nurse, who allowed just four hits and struck out seven, got the first batter out in the ninth on a line drive. Roger Stech, who had tripled earlier, doubled. After Nurse got Joe Connors on a fly ball, Heenan was

walked intentionally to get to Moyer. Moyer with a one ball, two strike count, homered to end the nine-inning game that lasted only 90 minutes.

George Neil got two of the Knight five hits off the left-handed Heenan. He got a double in the sixth and a single in the eighth.

Kuemper, now 3-3 in conference play, good for third place, hosts Lake City Wednesday night before traveling to Aurelia on Thursday night.

Perry can wrap up the league crown Wednesday night when they travel to second-place Jefferson.

# Jefferson Hits Tigers, 13-3

The Jefferson Rams launched a 10-hit offensive, coupled with eight Carroll Tiger errors gave the Rams a 13-3 win after six innings here Monday evening.

**The loss pushed the stumbling Tigers into the Midwest Conference Eastern Division basement with a 1-5 league mark, while their overall record dropped to two wins against nine losses.**

The Tigers started the game strong, leading 2-1 after the first stanza. Ron Anderson led off for the Tigers with a double to left-center, and scored on a double by the second man up, Tom Nam. Carroll pitcher for the first one-and-two-thirds innings, Pete Marz, then singled in Nam.

The second inning proved disastrous for the Bengals, as the Rams scored six runs on only three hits. First baseman Greg Hand led off with a single to right field, but an error on right fielder Reggie Conrad sent Hand to third. Hand scored as Steve Arbuckle singled to left.

Al Durbin followed suit with a single, and Leo Brooker walked to load the bases. A wild pitch from Marz scored Arbuckle from third. With runners at second and third, John Raver flew to center where the ball popped out of Lynn Olerich's glove sending in Durbin.

The inning progressed in the same manner until the damage report stood finally at six runs on three hits with one man being walked home, 12 batters sent to the plate and two Tiger errors.

The third inning saw the Rams score two additional runs on two hits. Raver, who was at bat five times in the contest and scored five runs, singled after lead-off batter Brooker had struck out. Raver stole second and advanced to third on a pass ball. Mike Wolterman singled to score Raver. Wolterman then stole second and moved to third on a bad throw in an attempt to stop a steal. Wolterman scored as Ram pitcher Chris Blackburn got to first on an error.

The Tigers scored their final run as Marz got on first when Ram catcher Ron Rohovit dropped a third strike on the Carroll batter. Marz moved to second on a picture bunt by Randy Plotz and then stole third. He scored on a pass ball.

The only scoreless inning for the Rams was the fifth, when sophomore Vince O'Connor took over the Carroll pitching duties. But the Tiger hurler was tagged for three runs in the sixth, bringing the score to 13-3 and ending the match due to the 10-run rule.

The Tigers travel to Denison Wednesday night for an 8 p.m. game with the Western Division leading Monarchs.
