Carroll overwhelmed Coon Rapids here Monday night, 404½ points to 118½ points to score their first swimming victory of the season after two opening losses.

Two other Carroll girls were triple-winners. Renee Dalhoff won the freestyle, individual medley and breast stroke in the 13-14 year-old division and Vicki Blum won the freestyle, individual medley and butterfly events in the 15-18 year-old bracket.

Two boys were triple-winners. Matt Lehman took the backstroke, breast stroke and freestyle in the eight-and-under division and Kevin Duncan won the freestyle, butterfly and individual medley in the 13-14 year-old class.

Denny Hallinan, Thomas Dalhoff, Ken Hanneman and Matt Furey were double-winners. Hallinan took the backstroke

Not Enough Nursing Home Beds Available

Despite the growing number of nursing homes, there are not enough in Carroll to take care of those waiting for admission, the Carroll Rotary club was told Monday night.

Since the development of penicillin, people are living longer and the number requiring care is rapidly increasing, Mrs. Sally Warne of the Carroll Manor said.

Women are living an average of 18 years longer and men 13 years, she said. Two-thirds of those in nursing homes today are women.

Mrs. Warne, who was introduced by Robert Woodhouse, said the average age of nursing home residents is 80. At least 50 per cent are disoriented or confused much of the time and require extra care.

There are three general types of nursing homes in operation today, Mrs. Warne said. They are privately-owned and operated, non-profit, largely run by church or charitable groups; and government-operated.

Carroll has three major nursing homes, she said, in addition to several custodial facilities.

Junior Editors Quiz on CHINESE PUG DOGS

QUESTION: What is the origin of the Chinese Pug dog?
ANSWER: The Pug, the largest of the toy dogs, is believed to have originated in China where most of the short-faced dogs with tightly-curling tails were bred. In its breeding, there appears to be an infusion of the blood of the Japanese Pug, a dog similar to the present day toy spaniel. The Pug is sometimes called the "Dutch Dog" because it was popular in Holland for many years. Traders of the Dutch East Indies Company introduced the Pug to England where it was favored by the ladies of the nobility. Lady Willoughby of England sponsored the breed, and its rise to popularity was rapid and well-deserved. In modern times, the breed was made popular through the Duke and Duchess of Windsor.

The Pug is a delightful little dog with a short wrinkled nose and a tail that curls over its back. It weighs between 14 and 18 pounds. The hair is smooth and short and is black or light brown in color. It is a fine house dog, amiable in disposition, alert and very clean. It requires a minimum of grooming and not the coddling of some of the other toys.
