

Reicks Scatters Nine Hits in Victory—

Kuemper Beats Carroll, 7-2

Tim Reicks scattered nine hits and recorded his second victory in four days as Kuemper whipped city rival, Carroll, 7-2, Wednesday night.

Reicks, who improved his record to 2-0, was in trouble the first three innings, but was able to work out of several jams.

The right hander loaded the bases in the first inning as Tom Nam singled and Jeff Petersen and Ted Nam walked, but he got losing pitcher Pete Marz to hit into a pitcher-home-first double play and got Steve Sundermann on a ground out to end the inning.

The Tigers, now 4-6 overall, loaded the bases again in the second inning as Dan Sheehan and Lonnie Lehrkamp singled and Tim Fredrickson walked after one out. But Reicks got

Tom Nam to hit into a forced out at home and got Petersen on a ground out to end another threat.

The Tigers finally got to Reicks in the third to grab a 1-0 lead. Ted Nam, who had a perfect night at the plate, collecting three hits, singled as did Marz. The run scored as Sundermann hit a ground ball. The throw to first was wild, allowing Nam to score.

Kuemper, now 9-5 overall and 4-2 in league play, got to Marz in the bottom of the fourth as Terry Kasperbauer and Mark Heithoff singled to put runners at second and third. Jeff Hunter then singled home one run and the other run came home as the ball got by centerfielder Tom Nam.

After Mark Hermesen and John Heithoff walked, Reicks walked with the bases loaded

to bring in one run and a sacrifice fly by Baldus scored the fourth run of the frame to make it 4-1.

Carroll threatened in the fifth on one-out singles by Ted Nam and Marz, but Reicks settled down and got out of the inning.

The Tigers got their final run of the game in the seventh as Petersen walked and Ted Nam singled. Marz grounded out to move the runners up to second and third. Then Sundermann grounded out, scoring Petersen.

Kuemper added a run in the fifth as Kasperbauer scored on a ground out by Mark Heithoff and got finished up with two more in the sixth on a two-run triple by Kasperbauer, following an error where Reicks

got on base and a single by Baldus.

Kuemper goes to Perry Friday night for a "key" Midwest Conference game, while Carroll will try to upset Jefferson, a team that has beaten Kuemper twice. Both games will start at 8 p.m.

The Knights took the preliminary game, 5-4, as Mike Gute was the winning pitcher and Tim Fredrickson the loser.
