

# Big Year for Iowa in Cage Recruiting

The Iowa Football Coaches Association Golf Tournament was held Monday at the rain-soaked Carroll Country Club and coaches from the University of Iowa, Drake University and Buena Vista College were present.

Dick Kuchen, assistant basketball coach at Iowa, said that the Hawkeyes had a banner year recruiting-wise.

"We have put two good years back-to-back of recruiting, the lanky coach said. "We had to do this to fulfill our needs."

In all, Dick Shultz and Kuchen came up with six highly sought after players. Of the six, only one is from Iowa. He is 6-6 forward Lee Border from HLTV of Victor who led his team to the runner-up spot in the state tournament and who was captain of the Class A all-tournament team.

"We were pleased to get Lee," added Kuchen. "He holds all the scoring and rebounding records at HLTV and we think he'll develop into a fine player."

Two guards were recruited out of Ohio. They are 6-2 Archie

Mays of Dayton and 6-3 John Hairston of Columbus.

"Mays is very quick. He can do a lot with the ball," said the Hawkeye assistant. "And Hairston is the type of player that control the club. He's a play-maker."

At forward, the Hawkeyes recruited 6-7 Bruce King out of Dayton, Ohio, and 6-7 Glenn Worley out of Benjamin Franklin High School in New York City.

"King is extremely physical at 215 pounds," said Kuchen. "His nickname is 'Sky' and he really gets up in the air."

Worley was an all-city selection and according to Kuchen, is another physical type player.

The Hawks recruited a swing man who can play either forward or guard. He is 6-5 Leon Thomas who comes from Libby High School in Toledo, Ohio. "He was all-state and he's very quick," said the Iowa assistant.

In order for the Hawkeyes to be a good ball club next year, Kuchen mentioned two things.

"First of all, we must get early development from our young players to fill the positions we lost, meaning at center where Kevin Kunnert graduated and

at guard where Rick Williams graduated."

Secondly, we feel if the club develops some cohesiveness and becomes a good working unit, that the Hawks could develop into a fine team."

Iowa's schedule won't be an easy one as they face Kansas, Kansas State, Kentucky, Marquette, UCLA, Wyoming and Northern Illinois for a non-conference schedule. Only Kansas and Kentucky are home games.

### Drake Football

Memphis State withdrew from the Missouri Valley Conference last Friday because of scheduling problems.

Drake University football coach, Jack Wallace, felt that Memphis State left the Valley because of finances. "It was all finances," said Wallace who has had only one losing season at Drake in nine years.

"They (Memphis) wanted to get into the Southeastern Conference and play close to home, but the Southeastern Conference didn't want them. In fact, numerous times the Southeastern Conference has turned them down," added the Bulldog coach.

Wallace mentioned that the league wants to get another school in league by the fall. He mentioned Southern Illinois, O'Grady . . . See Page 10

# Lehrkamp Saves Tigers, 3-2

A clutch relief performance by sophomore-to-be Lonnie Lehrkamp preserved a 3-2 Carroll victory over Manning here Monday night on a muddy Carroll Stadium field.

Lehrkamp, who started the game at second base, was called in to pitch with bases loaded and nobody out in the fifth inning.

Even though two wild pitches brought home two runs, Tiger brought home two runs, the Tiger youngster got out of the inning by getting Keith Stribe and Mark Rowedder on strikes and got Gary Graner to pop out.

When the inning was over, the Tigers held a 3-2 lead and that is the way it ended. Lehrkamp got into trouble in the sixth after walking two batters, but got out of the inning by fanning Rinke.

With runners at third and first base in the seventh and two out, Lehrkamp got Jim Mohr on a pop out to end the game and save the victory for starting

pitcher Pete Marz, his second win of the young season.

Marz, who went the distance in the Tigers' 14-3 romp over Audubon on Friday night, was breezing along on a two-hitter until the fifth. But an error and two walks finished him and that was when Lehrkamp came to the rescue.

Marz was effective until the fifth as he struck out 10 and allowed just two bases on balls through his four-inning stint.

Carroll scored all their runs off losing pitcher Graner in the second inning on just one hit. Steve Sundermann led off with a walk and moved up to second on a pass ball. Lonnie Lehrkamp was safe at first on a bunt attempt as the first baseman couldn't hold on to the ball. Tim Fredrickson was then hit by a pitch to load the bases.

The first Tiger run came as Jeff Petersen reached on an error. With the bases still loaded and only one out, Rick Beyer walked, forcing in a run. The final and deciding run scored on a Ted Nam single

to right that scored Fredrickson.

Graner, in a losing cause, allowed seven hits, allowing no earned runs, while walking three and striking out eight.

The Tigers will try to move their record to 3-0 when they host St. Bernard's of Breda Wednesday night at 8 p.m.

So would the New York Mets.

The New Yorkers' incredible run of injuries continued along with their recent slide Monday night when Harrelson suffered a fractured bone in his left hand during a 5-0 loss to the Cincinnati Reds and became the latest candidate for the disabled list.

Jones and Grote are currently on the list while Milner and Mays are recent removals, although Mays has yet to see action since coming off.

It was the fifth consecutive defeat for Jon Matlack, 2-8. The Rookie of the Year in 1972 hasn't won since April 28. Nor has he escaped the injury bugaboo. He suffered a hairline skull fracture when hit by a line drive last month and missed a couple of starts.
