

Tiger Strength: Pitching

What was supposed to be a veteran baseball team for Carroll High School this summer isn't so, according to coach Ted Edwards who is busy preparing the team for their season opener Friday night at Audubon. (6:30 game time).

"We had lettermen coming back at every infield position, but that's gone," commented Edwards who is beginning his fourth year at the Tiger helm.

"I thought we would be a contender for the Midwest Conference crown, but shortstop Tim Fredrickson and Dan Sheehan, both veterans, have decided to pass up their final year of competition."

Pitching appears to be the

team's overall strength as Pete Marz and Lonnie Lehrkamp return.

Marz led the team in about every pitching category last year, compiling a 6-3 record on a team that went 9-8 and added 69 strikeouts in 45 innings.

Lehrkamp had 3-4 mark in 50 innings a year ago and added 53 strikeouts to go along with a team leading earned run average of 2.94.

Edwards is expecting a lot of help from newcomers Todd Pettitt, Tom Reiman and southpaw Eric Siemer who will be depended on for relief duty.

"Last year Marz would start a game then Lehrkamp relieve and vice-versa," Edwards noted. "But this year we don't have to do things that way."

Gymnastics Class to be Offered Again

Gymnastics classes will again be held this summer for all interested children in the Carroll area through the cooperation of the Carroll Public School system.

The course will be conducted Monday through Friday for four weeks from June 3rd to June 28. All morning classes will be 50 minutes and will be held in the small gym at the public high school.
