

Nurse, Roetker Pace KHS

LAKE CITY — Tom Nurse scattered three hits and third baseman Tim Roetker in his first varsity start for the Knights lashed four hits as Kuemper opened its Midwest Conference campaign with a 5-0 triumph over Lake City here Monday night.

Nurse, a righthander, was never in serious trouble as he gave up a single to Randy Hight in the second; Larry McCaulley in the fifth and losing pitcher Clark Johnson in seventh.

Johnson got the farthest of any Eagle baserunner as he reached second base with one out in the seventh, but Nurse got McCaulley on a strikeout and Hight on a ground out to end the game.

The Knights backed Nurse's seven strikeouts and shutout pitching by banging 12 hits off of Johnson.

Lou Galetich's club did most

of their scoring early as they picked up single runs in the first and second and added

two more in the third for a 4-0 bulge. A fifth run came in the fifth.

Mark Hermesen led off the first with a single and stole second and then came home later as first baseman John Heithoff was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded.

In the second, Tim Roetker doubled to left center with two out and came home on a single by Hermesen.

In the third inning, Nurse singled to start the uprising and went to second on a wild pickup attempt by Russ Rupiper.

With two out, Johnson reached base on an error and moved to second on a stolen base.

Then Tim Roetker's brother, Joe, lined a double to left, scoring two runs for a 4-0

lead.

The Knights got their final run as Jeff Hunter reached on an error and moved to second on an infield single by Rupiper.

After Joe Roetker struck out, Larry McClellan walked to load the bases. Then Tim Roetker's sacrifice fly, scored Hunter.

Kuemper, now 1-1, was playing today at Fort Dodge against the Dodgers and return home for a league game against Jefferson on Friday night at 8 p.m.

Carroll Gets Revenge, 11-1

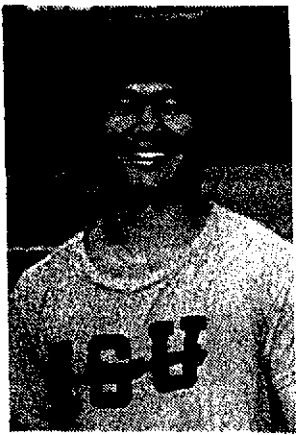
Carroll won a revenge game here Monday night by topping Audubon 11-1 in a game called in the sixth inning because of the 10-run rule.

The win raised the Tigers' record to 3-2, the only blemishes coming at the hands of Audubon May 31 in a doubleheader that opened the season for Carroll.

The big Carroll inning was the fifth, when they sent 12 men to bat, scoring seven runs on three hits. Five bases on balls and one hit batsman helped the cause along.

The Tigers had taken a narrow 2-0 lead into the fifth, but Ted Nam opened the frame up with a single and Carroll was on its way.

A hit batsman and three straight walks followed to force in a pair of runs for Carroll. The two run-scoring walks came off Audubon

pitcher Don Jacobsen in relief of Mike Smith, who had control problems with the first three batters.

Jacobsen then picked up a strike out and a fly out before he forced in another run with a walk. The score was now 5-0.

Then Lonnie Lehrkamp

smashed a bases-loaded double, scoring all three runners. With the score 8-0, Nam came to the plate for the second time in the inning and slugged a single that scored Lehrkamp.

Audubon managed a pair in the top of the sixth, but a run of tallies by the Tigers ended the game in the bottom of the frame.

Carroll Coach Ted Edwards had praise for two Tigers in particular. "Nam managed three hits in 'nam at-bats and Larry Bock handled the catching chores in top-notch fashion," said Edwards.

The loss lowered Audubon's record to 2-3 on the season.

Next up for the Carroll diamond men is a home contest against Perry Wednesday at 8 p.m. The encounter will be in Carroll Stadium and will be the first

game to count in the conference standings.
