Perry Blanks Tigers, 11-0

Perry shutout Carroll, 11-0, in baseball Wednesday night at Carroll Stadium, ending the Tigers' three-game winning streak and spoiling Ted Edwards' club Midwest Conference opener.

The Bluejays, now 3-5 on the year and loser to five Des Moines schools, pushed across eight runs in the first four innings and ended things in the sixth with another three runs putting the 10-run into effect.

Carroll coach Dean Witmer said after the game, "it was the poorest effort of the year. Any resemblance of us to a baseball team was purely coincidental."

Dean Witmer's Perry club banged out nine hits off of Tiger pitcher Pete Marz, but poor fielding didn't help the

Tiger righthander.
The Tigers committed seven errors in the game and only four of the runs off of Marz were earned.

Perry got its first run of the night in the first frame as Tim Moyer singled, stole second and came home on a single by catcher Donnie Lapp.

They made it 3-0 after two as Tim Keenen singled, stole second and went to third on a pass ball.

The next batter, Allan Lenz walked and moved to second on a stolen base. Then Randy Ingalls singled home two runs for a 3-0 margin.

The Bluejays made it 6-0 after the third with the help of two errors, a hit batsman and only one hit, a triple by Keenan.

The Tigers, now 3-3, will try to get back in winning column Friday night at Lake City in an 8 p.m. game.


They return home Monday for an 8 p.m. game against city rival Kuemper.

Cleveland Ace Gains 11th Win In a Row

It was supposed to be a pair of aces. But one of them turned out to be the four of clubs.

The ace was Cleveland's Gaylord Perry, who dealt Chicago a six-hitter Wednesday night for his 11th victory of the season—his 11th straight since an opening-day loss.

The other ace was the White Sox' Wilbur Wood, who was also going for No. 11 but got clubbed for eight runs in the fourth inning, a bombardment

that enabled the Indians to breeze to a 10-1 romp.

In other American League games, Boston beat Oakland 5-3, New York topped California 6-4, Detroit trounced Texas 7-0, Baltimore edged Minnesota 4-3 and Kansas City clipped Milwaukee 4-3 in 13 innings.

"He's still a hell of a pitcher," Perry said of Wood. "Nobody knows better than I that he beat us eight times in a row."

But now it's Perry who's beating everybody in a row.

"I take a great deal of pride trying to finish what I start out there," he said. "When you get a big lead, there's a tendency to relax. I was really bearing down in the late innings, especially against their big hitters."

Mario Guerrero drove in three Boston runs, two with an eighth-inning tie-breaking single, to beat Oakland and give the Red Sox their eighth victory in the last 11 games.

Yanks 6, Angels 4
Elliott Maddox's two-run

double triggered a four-run fourth that carried the Yankees past California. Frank Robinson drove in two of the Angels' runs and scored one.

Tigers 7, Rangers 0
Mickey Lolich fired a six-hitter for his eighth straight complete game, his first shutout of the season and 36th of his career, and got all the support he needed with a five-run fourth that carried Detroit past Ferguson Jenkins and the Rangers.

Orioles 4, Twins 3
Don Baylor drove in two runs and scored one against Minnesota to help Mike Cuellar to his eighth straight victory for the Orioles. Cuellar out-duelled Vic Albury, who allowed just three hits before leaving after seven innings.

Palmer 30-1 Choice at Open; But Still A Crowd Favorite

MAMARONECK, N.Y. — Arnold Palmer lashed into an drive on the 448-yard finishing hole at Winged Foot and typically as he lost his balance as the follow through on his violent swing.

"Oooh!" chorused the sizeable gallery around the 18th tee. "Yeah! Yeah!" came the roar from down the fairway.

When Palmer reached his ball he found himself 10 to 20 yards behind his companions in the practice round—Tom Weiskopf, Bert Yancey and Tony Jacklin, all of whom comfortably reached the green in two.

Using a wood, Palmer hit the ball fat, picking up a divot, and watched the ball fall some 40 yards short of the green. His shoulders slumped. He muttered something under his breath. Then he tossed his club toward his bag in disgust.

"Kinda fat on that fairway shot," commented a friend.

"Fat, hell," blurted Palmer. "I almost struck out."

"It's been this kind of year, you might say almost this kind of a decade, for the one-time miracle charger from Latrobe, Pa., whose birdie finishes in the late 1950s and early 1960s sent golf into a heady, multimillion-dollar spiral from which it is still spinning—and from which others are still profiting.

"Sure, I get discouraged at times," the graying, 44-year-old four-time Masters

winner said afterward. "But I always feel that some day I'm going to put everything together again."

"If I didn't think I could still win, I'd never pick up a bag of clubs in a big tournament again."

Palmer refused to be chastened by unofficial odds which made him a 30-1 outsider in the 74th U.S. Open Championship, beginning today over the tight and demanding Winged Foot Club course.

Palmer's last major victory was the 1964 Masters. His last tournament triumph was the

Hope Classic in the winter of 1973, and it followed a 17-month drought.

Despite his slump, Palmer remains the idol of the crowds. He has lost few of his so-called Arnie's Nick to the successful Jack Nicklaus and Gary Players and the new young lions such as Johnny Miller and Hubert Green.

"That's what bothers me more than anything, not being able to deliver for all the people that are pulling for me," Palmer said. "I worry about them, more than I worry about myself. . . ."
