Wildness Lifts Carroll, 9-8

Carroll took advantage of five walks and three Kueemper errors in the sixth inning and rallied for five runs and a 9-8 victory over the Knights in Midwest Conference baseball play Monday night at Carroll Stadium.

It wasn't the best baseball played, but it was exciting as the Tigers wiped out an 8-4 deficit to overhaul the Knights.

There were several interesting facts about the game. Both teams made three errors, but Lou Galetich's club made all of theirs in the Tiger big sixth. Secondly, Kueemper outdid the Tigers, ten to four.

But the big story was in the base on balls department where Kueemper pitchers, starter Alan Kohorst and Mike Gute combined for 16 walks.

Gute relieved Kohorst in the sixth and his teammates gave him a four-run cushion.

But two walks and an error loaded the bases. With one out,

Todd Pettitt hit a slow roller to Kueemper third baseman Tom Nurse. Nurse tried for a force out at second, but his throw was wild and three runs scored. Pettitt went all the way to third on the play.

The next batter, Larry Bock, reached on an error, allowing Pettitt to score to tie the game at eight-all.

Then Gute had control problems again as he walked Jeff Petersen and Tom Reiman to load the bases.

Gute got tough and retired Todd Buck on a short fly to right, but walked Ron Bernholtz to force in Bock with what proved to be the winning run.

Then Carroll pitcher Pete Marz, who worked out of trouble all night, had his easiest inning of the game by getting Mark Hermesen and

Jeff Hunter on ground balls and Phil Baldus on strikes to end the game and preserve the victory for the Tigers, their second victory ever in baseball over Kueemper.

Carroll jumped out to a 2-0 lead after two innings as Kohorst who walked 11 batters in five innings, loaded them up in the second. Then Bock drilled a two-run single to right center for the runs.

But Kueemper fought back in the third to take a 5-4 lead as singles by Mike Gute and Joe Roetker got the first run.

The next four runs came with the help of two errors and two walks.

Kueemper made it 7-2 after four as Baldus walked and stole second. He came around on a single by Tom Nurse. A single by Russ Rupiper followed one out later to score Nurse.

The Tigers battled back in the fifth with two runs to narrow the deficit to 7-4 as Ted

Nam, Eric Siemer and Todd Pettitt singled. Three walks also helped the Tigers in the frame.

Kueemper made it 8-4 in the top of the sixth, but then the roof fell in for the Knights.

Kueemper, now 2-3 overall and 2-1 in loop play, was playing at St. Edmond Fort Dodge today.

The Tigers, 5-3 on the year and 2-1 in league action, were idled today, but were preparing for a game Wednesday night at home against Denison.
