

Perry Pitcher Carstens Unbeatable in 4-0 Triumph Over Carroll

PERRY — Perry righthander Rick Carstens was unbeatable here Wednesday night as he scattered four hits and fanned 20 Carroll batters in a 4-0 victory.

The 6-foot 2-inch Bluejay, who recently fanned 19 in a triumph over Lake City,

managed three strikeouts every inning except the first when Ted Nam was thrown out on a grounder to first baseman Kevin Mack.

The Tigers' Lonnie Lehrkamp also pitched well, allowing seven hits and fanning three, but was touched for single runs in the

fourth and sixth and two runs in the fifth.

Perry's first run, the only one they needed as it turned out, came as Tim Keenan singled, stole second and third and came home on a pass ball.

Perry made it 3-0 in the fifth as Randy Ingalls led off with a double and scored on a two-out single to center by Jeff Thorpe. Thorpe later scored on a pass ball.

The final run scored in the sixth as Jim Lenz walked and

one out. After Tom Reiman fanned, Buck lined a single to put runners at first and second. But Carstens then struck out Nam to end the threat.

In the sixth, Nam doubled to deep left center with two out, but was left on as Eric Siemer struck out.

And in the seventh, Todd Pettitt singled to start the inning. Then Lehrkamp walked, but Carstens ended things in short order with three straight strikeouts.

Carroll, now 2-3 in Midwest Conference play, hosts Lake City in another league game Friday night. The Tigers' overall record is 5-6.

Perry is now 4-1 in loop play and 5-6 overall.
