Carroll Takes Opener, 3-2

Audubon's left hander Don Jacobsen walked Carroll's Brad Edwards with the bases loaded here Saturday night forcing in Tom Reiman with the winning run as the Tigers kicked off their baseball season with a 3-2 triumph.

The game went eight innings and there was to have been a second contest, but it was rained out.

Jacobsen, who had relieved started Roger Randeris in the sixth when the Tigers threatened, struck out Carroll's leadoff batter in the eighth, Gary Luchtel.

But winning pitcher Reiman and Jim Petersen then walked. An infield error put Todd Buck on first and then Jacobsen walked Edwards for the winning tally.

Both teams had their chances to win the game, but Jacobsen looking sharp in the sixth and seventh stopped the Tigers, while Reiman was outstanding in relief for Ted Edwards' team.

Carroll starter, southpaw Eric Siemer, went six strong innings before tiring in the seventh. He allowed just three hits and fanned 13.

In the seventh, Siemer walked two batters and hit another to load the bases.

Then Reiman came to the rescue as he fanned two batters and got another to fly out to center.

Petersen, Reiman and Siemer were the hitting stars as they each collected two hits.

Reiman's first hit, a single in the fourth tied things up at 2-2.

Carroll has scored in the first inning on a single to Buck, a walk to Edwards and Siemer's fielder's choice.

Fourth No-Hitter for Angels' Ryan

The crowd of 18,492 was screaming with every pitch Nolan Ryan threw. Ruth Ryan watched her husband from the stands, tensing with each delivery. Even his California Angels teammates felt the pressure.

But not Ryan. While everyone around him was swept up in the excitement, the flame throwing right-hander was cool as ice as he etched his niche in baseball's record books with the fourth no-hitter of his career.

"It's just something that happens," said Ryan, whose 1-0 masterpiece against the Baltimore Orioles Sunday put him alongside Sandy Koufax as the only pitchers in major league history with four no-hitters. "I never give it a lot of thought — really I don't."

Mickey Lolich scattered seven hits in the opener for the 201st victory of his career, making the 13-year veteran the winningest Detroit left-hander ever. Also, Lolich's three strikeouts put him one ahead of Bob Feller for sixth place on the all-time list with 2,582 and left him just one behind Warren Spahn among all left-handers.

Chicago pulled out the second game when Deron Johnson walked with the bases loaded in the fifth inning, forcing home the winning run.
