## Carroll Takes Loop Opener

LAKE CITY — Carroll capitalized on eight walks and three errors by host Lake City to win its Midwest Conference opening game.

The 7-3 win Friday night raised the Tigers' season mark to 3-1 heading into Monday night's clash with Kuemper. Lake City dropped to 1-2.

After falling behind the Eagles 2-0 in the first inning thanks to Larry McCaulley's triple and Randy Winter's single, Carroll took the lead for good in the second stanza.

The visitors left the bases loaded in the second, but used five walks, a hit and an error to grab a 3-2 lead. Eagle pitcher Dave McIntire walked in two of the runs and a sacrifice fly by Todd Buck

accounted for the other one.

It was not McIntire's night. The pitcher was relieved in the second after allowing another walk with a man on base.

Tiger shortstop Lonny Lehrkamp said the reason Carroll was hitting and McIntire was wild was that his curve ball was breaking "long before it reaches the plate."

Brian Johnson replaced McIntire and held the Tigers down until the sixth inning, when three more runs crossed the plate.

Ron Bernholtz knocked the three runs in as the first baseman slammed a home run in the park which doesn't have an outfield fence.

Buck hit a double and Eric Siemer managed a triple for the two Carroll extra-base hits.

The Tigers had problems with leaving men on base once again as they stranded eight.

The Carroll pitching staff gave up its first earned runs of the season in the first inning on McCaulley's triple off Todd Pettitt, who went all the way on the mound for Carroll.

The win here was the second in a row for the Tigers, who had not won on this field for many years before 1974.

# Errors Cost Kuemper, 5-1

Kuemper didn't make an error Wednesday night in a 7-6 loss to the state's third-ranked Fort Dodge Dodgers, but Friday night here at Carroll Stadium they made six and they dropped their Midwest Conference opener to Jefferson, 5-1.

The Knights, now 2-3 overall, must now get ready for tonight as they meet city rival Carroll at 8 p.m. in a crucial contest for both schools.

A loss for Kuemper would hurt their conference title hopes, while a Carroll victory would enhance theirs as they opened Friday with a 7-3 loop win over Lake City.

Chris Blackburn was

superb on the mound for the Rams as he allowed just four hits and fanned six as the winners boosted their overall mark to 4-0.

Kuemper's Alan Kohorst was just as good. The senior right hander yielded five hits, walked none and struck out eight. He allowed five runs, but only one was earned.

The game was scoreless through the first three innings, then the Rams took a 2-0 lead in the fourth as Nick Wand reached on an error. A single by Blackburn moved Wand to third and another error loaded the bases.

With two down, first baseman Eldo Walker lined a two-run single to score Wand

and Blackburn.

Kuemper narrowed the deficit to 2-1 in their fifth as Terry Hammen singled to right, moved to second on a dropped third strike. He went to third on a pass ball and scored on Jeff Hamers' second hit of the game, a single.

A two-base error, a stole base and a ground out made it 3-1 for Jefferson after six frames and they wrapped it up in the seventh by getting two insurance runs with the help of another Kuemper error.

Kuemper's only serious threat outside of the fifth came in the third when Hamers tripled to center to

lead off the inning. But the next three Knights couldn't do anything.
