LAKE VIEW — Carroll High School opened their baseball season here Monday night, sweeping a doubleheader from Lake View-Auburn, 6-2, in the opener and 14-0 in the nightcap.
Carroll will open their Midwest Conference season at home Wednesday night against Audubon. Lefty Eric Siemer will probably be on the mound.

First Game
Mark Steffen's tie-breaking three-run triple in the fifth inning snapped a 2-2 tie.

The Tigers, who were held hitless until the fifth by Lloyd Helgersen, got things started

when Brad Edwards reached first on an error after Jim Petersen had grounded out. Siemer then broke up Helgersen's no-hit bid by singling to left. After Jerry Hammers walked to fill the bases, Steffen unloaded his triple to deep left center.
Carroll got their final run of the inning as winning pitcher Todd Pettitt singled home Steffen.
Pettitt allowed just two hits and fanned eight in going the distance.

The Tigers built up a 2-0 lead in the second on walks to Steffen and Pettitt, a pass ball and an error.

Lake View-Auburn, now 0-3 on the season, showed their only offense of the night as Jeff Morenz and Rick Nelsen

walked in their second.
Incoming freshman Reggie Schoneboom then moved the runners to second and third with a sacrifice bunt and both runners came home on Derek Rhode's single to center.

Second Game
Tom Reiman allowed just one base runner, Schoneboom's leadoff single in the bottom of the first inning as he then retired the next 12 batters, 10 of them on strikeouts.

Carroll didn't need any offensive punch, even though they did manage six hits in the abbreviated four-inning game.

Four Lake View-Auburn

hurlers walked 16 Carroll batters, including 10 in the third frame when the Tigers scored 11 runs on just three hits.

Carroll got the only run they needed when Reiman singled home Steffen in the second.

Besides scoring by walks in the third, Carroll's other runs came on a triple by Petersen to left which brought in Todd Buck; Brad Edwards' double that chased Petersen in the third; and Jim Mollitor's two-run single that brought Buck and Jim Mollitor home later on in the inning.

Carroll made it 14-0 in the fourth inning on two runs. Both runs came home as a

result of five walks and a ground out.

Baseball Notes:
Schoneboom and catcher Tim Rardin are incoming freshmen, playing for Coach Jeff Trost's baseball club at LV-A, which is a rarity.

Trost, who was an All-Iowa Conference catcher at Buena Vista for three years and was all-conference football player his senior season, will also be head football coach, replacing Wayne White.

Trost is a native of Churdan where his father, Paul, has been long-time athletic director and coach.



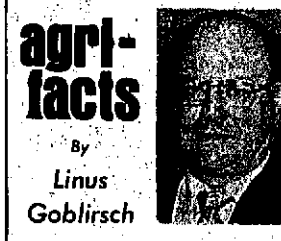

Schechtman Gets 6th; Title to Thiedeman

DES MOINES — Carroll High School sophomore Steve Schechtman placed sixth in the Class A long jump Friday at the four-class state track meet at Drake Stadium.
Schechtman, who was the Tigers' only representative here, leaped 21 feet, one inch. His previous best was 20-6.
Kuemper, which had five participants, competing in Class 2A, didn't score any points.
Their best effort came from junior Tim Gradoville, who finished seventh in the two-mile run.
Gradoville's time was 9:36.6, breaking his own school mark by five seconds.
The Knights' Rick Friedman, who has high jumped 6-5 1/2 this spring, couldn't get untracked in that event Saturday morning.
Friedman made the starting height of six feet, but went out at 6-2. The winner was Fort Dodge's Brad Kuhn at 6-4.
Kuemper's smile relay team finished fifth in their heat Saturday.
The team of Brad Reiman, Ryan Harnack, Kevin Tessmer and Friedman were timed in 3:33.2, four seconds off their school record they had set in the district meet at Fort Dodge.
On Friday, Friedman competed in the long jump. His best leap was 20 feet, nine inches which wasn't good enough to qualify for the finals.
Ar-We-Va's Ross Thiedeman and Bayard's Kirby Gilson competing in Class C were the only area boys to win titles.
Thiedeman, a junior, won the 120 yard high hurdles in 15 seconds flat.
Later on Saturday, Thiedeman finished second in the 180 yard low hurdles in 20.6.
Graettinger's Mike Masters won the event in a record time

Plastic food has come one step closer with the successful marketing of a new human food protein called "Torutein." This latest step away from natural protein is a derivative of petroleum grown as a yeast from a culture of ethyl alcohol. Most of the buyers will be food processors trying to enhance the flavor of simulated foods now on the market and running into consumer resistance because of taste. Another major market will be bakery products where the oil invader has the extra advantage of a nutritive complement in addition to protein (its only high amino acid, lysine, is desirable in most bakery products). And money, which went into the research and marketing of an oil-derived protein should illustrate to everyone the critical importance of research to develop and enhance all food-protein sources.



Carroll Takes 9th

IOWA CITY — Carroll High School placed ninth out of 20 schools in the Class 1A state boys' golf tournament here Friday and Saturday at the University of Iowa's Finkbine course.

Algonia Garrison successfully defended their team championship with a 634 as West Branch was a close second at 636. Carroll finished with a two-day total of 659.

Carroll, which placed fourth last year, was paced by Todd Pettitt with a 84-80 for 81s for a 162 total, followed by Tom Reiman at 84-80 for 164.

"Outside of Garrigan and West Branch, the teams were even," commented Tiger Head Coach Bill Evans.

"It was a beautiful day Friday, but was horrible Saturday as it poured rain," continued Evans whose team was making their fifth state appearance in seven years.

"The kids achieved four of six goals," continued the Carroll coach. "They won the conference, won their invitational and won the sectional and district titles."

"They didn't go undefeated or win state, but we're still hoping to win the state one of these years," continued Evans.

"It was a good golf course and the kids learned a lot. There were 120 some traps on the course," continued Evans.

The Tigers will be strong again next year as only Jerry Dentlinger is gone and Evans said, "we got some good kids coming up."

Dave Rummels of runner-up West Branch took

medalist honors with a 78-68 for a 146.
