

# Tigers Go 14-0 in League

SAC CITY — Carroll capped their first Midwest Conference baseball championship here Friday night, beating Sac City, 7-1.

The Tigers ended their league season at 14-0 and upped their overall mark to a glittering 19-1 mark.

Coach Ted Edwards' club faces No. 5 St. Bernard of Breda at 8 p.m. tonight at Carroll Stadium in a preview of Monday night's opening round sectional tournament clash.

Right hander Tom Reiman

and southpaw Eric Siemer combined for a one-hitter against the Indians.

Reiman went the first six innings, allowing the only hit, a single by Dave Galbraith in the sixth when the losers scored their lone run on a wild pickoff attempt at first. Reiman's mark is now 4-0.

Siemer finished up, going the last frame, striking out two.

The Tigers jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the third as Jim Petersen doubled home Todd Buck and Siemer singled home Petersen.

Carroll upped their lead to

4-0 in the fourth as Todd Buck drilled a single to score Gary Luchtel and Reiman who had reached on errors.

Brad Edwards scored Carroll's fifth run in the fifth. He singled and later raced home on a wild pitch.

Carroll got single runs in the sixth and seventh innings on a run-scoring single by Mark Steffes and another run-scoring double by Petersen respectively.

Siemer leads the club in hitting at .360, followed by Edwards at .334.

Siemer leads in hits at 22

and runs batted in with 19.

Buck and Petersen are second in hits at 20 and Hamers is second in RBI's at 18.

Pitching-wise, Pettitt, 9-0 on the year, has given up a remarkable three earned runs in 43 innings, while fanning 61.

Siemer has allowed just 10 earned runs in 43 innings. He has struck out 46.

## Fidrych, Hunter Head AL Pitching

NEW YORK (AP) — Rookie sensation Mark "the Bird" Fidrych and five-time 20-game winner Catfish Hunter head the American League's nine-man All-Star pitching staff, announced today by Boston Red Sox Manager Darrell Johnson.

Johnson, manager of the American League's for the 47th All-Star Game July 13 at Philadelphia, hopes his staff of five starters and four relievers can reverse the trend that has carried the National League to victory in 12 of the last 13 midseason games, including last year's

6-3 triumph.

Four of the nine hurlers are All-Stars for the first time, including non-conformist of the Detroit Tigers, whose crowd-pleasing antics include talking to the ball and getting down on his hands and knees to smooth out the pitching mound. He leads the regular AL pitchers with a 1.85 earned run average and has a 9-1 record. The other All-Star newcomers are AL strikeout leader Frank Tanana of the California Angels, Bill Travers of the Milwaukee Brewers and relief ace Dave LaRoche of the Cleveland Indians.

Completing the staff are Boston's Luis Tiant, selected for the third time, Oakland's Rollie Fingers, also for the third time, and second-timers Rich Gossage of the Chicago White Sox and Sparky Lyle of the Yankees.

The veteran of the staff is Hunter, the New York Yankee ace right-hander, who has been named for the eighth time — six times while he was with the Oakland A's. Hunter has appeared in five All-Star Games. He was tagged for two of the three runs the National League scored in the ninth inning last year, when it broke a 3-3 tie and sent Hunter to his second All-Star loss. He was the loser in the 1967 game.

The regular starters include Hunter, 10-7; Tiant, 10-5; Tanana, 10-5; Travers, 9-6; and Fidrych. Tanana and Travers are the left-handed hurlers among the group.

Tiant's two appearances on the AL All-Star staff both have resulted in losses, in 1968 when he was with Cleveland and in 1974 when he was with Boston.

The relievers on the squad are left-handers Lyle and LaRoche and right-handers Fingers and Gossage, who has doubled as a starter and reliever this season.

Lyle tops the relievers with 16 saves, while Fingers has 11 and LaRoche has 10.

Johnson said he hasn't made up his mind yet on which pitchers will get into the game, and in what order.

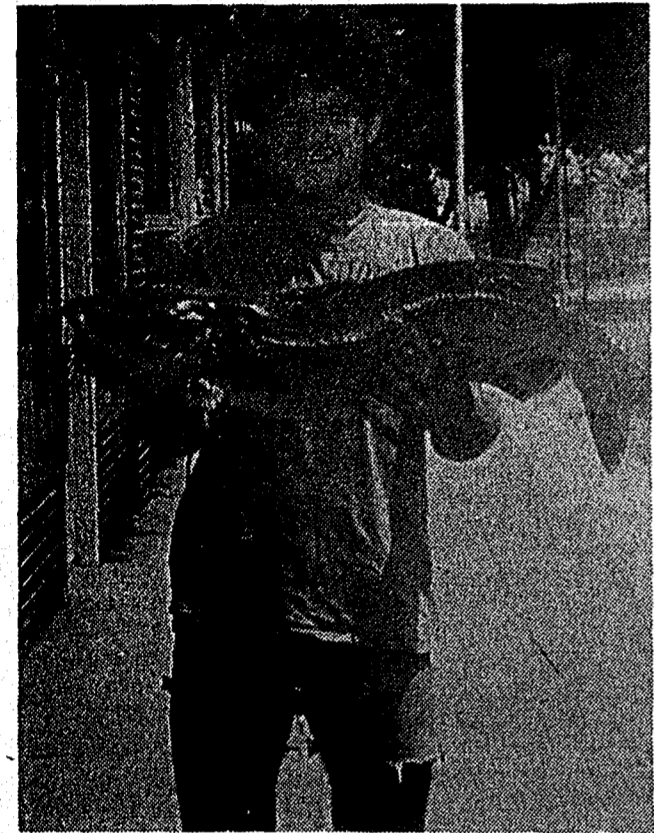

# Knights Fall to 5-9 Mark

FORT DODGE — Bart Warren pitched a no-hitter against Kuemper "just" a week ago.

He didn't do it Monday night, but his four-hitter was good enough to give the Dodgers a 6-1 triumph here over Kuemper, handing the Knights their third straight defeat and dropping their record to 5-9.

The Knights' collecting hits off of the right-handed Warren were first baseman John Loew who collected two singles, catcher Jim Hinners who had a single and left fielder Mark Reicks who doubled.

Kuemper grabbed a short-lived 1-0 lead in the third as losing pitcher Kirk Lengeling scored on the two-base hit by Reicks.

The sophomore Lengeling, who was making his first varsity start, didn't pitch that bad, scattering nine hits and allowing just two earned runs.

The Dodgers tied things at

one in their half of the third on a single by Reggie Waggoner.

They made it 3-1 in the fourth on a leadoff triple by Mark Kinseth who later raced in on a groundout. The other run scored on an error.

Fort Dodge made it 4-1 in the fifth as Frank Ludgate scored on a balk.

The Dodgers added two more runs in the sixth.

Roetker leads the club with a .394 average, followed by Rich Berg at .357.

"We were really happy with our showing over the weekend against some of the state's best competition," Knight Head Coach Bill Wieland said.

"Basically, the kids have progressed and are working hard. They have a ways to go, but we should be a pretty stable club by district time."

FORT DODGE — St. Edmond captured consolation honors in their own tournament here Saturday night, blanking Kuemper, 3-0.

Left hander Rick Scherff, who has thrown three no-hitters in the Gaels' 21-2 season, stopped the Knights on two hits, and fanned 13.

Mark Reicks collected both Kuemper hits, singling in the first and sixth innings.

As was the case in a 2-1 loss to Dubuque Wahlert earlier in the day, the Knights got good pitching, but were hurt by errors.

Sophomore Paul Baldus, who pitched Thursday's victory at Harlan, pitched in defeat.

He scattered eight hits in going the route, but three unearned runs was the difference.

St. Edmond got single runs in the third, sixth and seventh frames.

Joe Shanks, who had three hits, got on base on an error in the third and scored on Dan Flattery's single to center.

Shanks scored in the sixth after Dave Flattery reached base on an error with two outs.

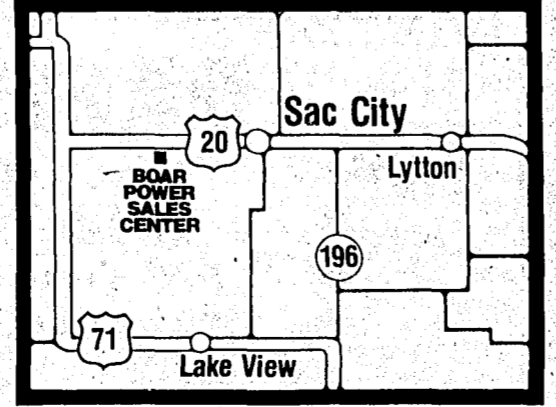
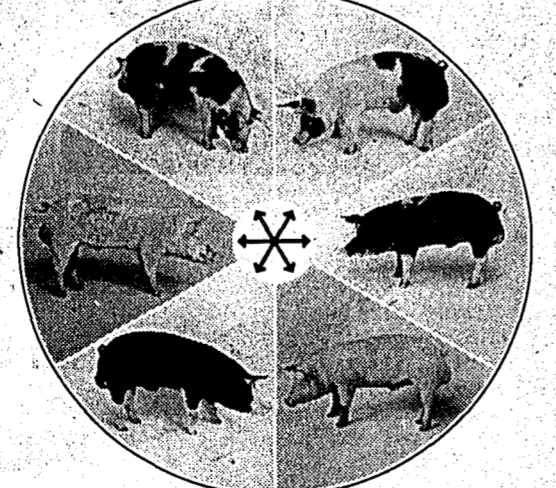
