

Tigers 1st on No-Hitter

 Todd Pettitt and Eric Siemer combined on a five-inning no-hitter here Friday night as Carroll took over sole possession of first-place in the Midwest Conference race with a 15-0 rout of Lake City.
 Pettitt went the first three innings, striking out six and not walking a batter in running personal mark to 3-0 on the year and 14-1 over the past two seasons.
 The lefty Siemer finished up, going the final two innings, walking three and striking out

four.
 The game was decided in the first inning when the Tigers sent 15 men to bat and scored 11 times.
 Jim Petersen, Brad Edwards, Tom Reiman and Jim Molitor supplied the big bats in the inning.
 Petersen slammed a two-run homer over the left center field wall to make it 6-0 after Molitor, who went three-for-three, drilled a two-run single.
 Earlier Reiman delivered a fly ball to left field that was misjudged and fell for a two-run single to give Carroll

a quick 2-0 lead.
 Edwards capped off the first frame by belting a grand slam homer to right to make it 10-0. The left handed batter also singled in Carroll's final run in the fourth.
 "It was a good team effort," said Tiger Head Coach Ted Edwards whose team hosts Manning at 8 p.m. tonight.
 "Our bats finally came alive," continued Edwards, "and I was pleased with Pettitt and Siemer on the mound. Siemer found his fast ball."
 The wildest play of the game came in the Lake City fifth as

Mark Conrad led off with a walk and John Christensen was hit by a pitch.
 Siemer didn't waste any time with them. He picked off Christensen at first and on the same play Conrad got hooked in a rundown between second and third and was tagged out.
 Lake City, now 2-1 in conference play and 3-2 overall, hosts Perry tonight.


Sports Glances

 The tournament is scheduled to be held Saturday, June 18 with a rain date of Saturday, June 25. The entry







Minnesota, Baylor Battle to 3-3 Tie

OMAHA, Neb. (AP) — Don't tell Minnesota and Baylor — or the crowd of 8,869 that showed up Sunday night for the College World Series — the one about a tie being as exciting as kissing your sister.
 They won't believe it.
 Tournament co-favorite Minnesota and Baylor scrapped to a 3-3 tie when a downpour forced the game to be suspended in the top of the 11th inning.
 Minnesota Coach Dick Siebert summed it up best: "That was some kind of show for baseball fans. There was something for everybody. Maybe it wasn't beautiful, but it was one lot of baseball."
 Along the way the crowd saw:
 —A submarine pitcher who walked 10 but who was still around at the end.
 —Minnesota's third base

coach, ex-major leaguer George Thomas, ejected from the game and then reportedly making a comment about the afternoon drinking habits of some umpires.
 The game was moved to the evening after a brief afternoon shower and thus forced the two night games — Southern Illinois, 39-10, vs. Arizona State, 53-11, and California State-Los Angeles, 41-20, vs. South Carolina, 41-10-1 — to Monday night.
 BREDA — St. Bernard of Breda won their own invitational baseball tournament here Sunday behind the perfect no-hit pitching of Dale Steinkamp.
 Steinkamp fanned all 15 batters he faced as the Bobcats routed Fonda, 14-0, in the title game.
 It was the first perfect game ever pitched by Steinkamp and it was his seventh career no-hitter. Steinkamp also homered.
 Ken Schettler slammed three homers and Marty Snyder added one also for the Bobcats who earlier Sunday downed Odebolt-Arthur, 14-3, behind the pitching of Bart Brinckers who tossed a four-hitter.
 Breda, now 10-2, travels to Elk Horn-Kimballton for a 7 p.m. game tonight.
 Odebolt-Arthur took third with a 9-5 win over Battle Creek.
