Kuemper and Carroll Win; Meet Saturday

As expected, Kuemper and Carroll won opening round Class AA district tournament games here Thursday night at Carroll Stadium.

The two rivals, who will meet Saturday night at 8 p.m. here, however had to struggle for awhile.

Kuemper broke a 2-2 tie in the fifth to oust stubborn Audubon 6-2 and Carroll rallied from a 3-0 deficit to start the fifth and posted a 9-4 victory.

For the two city schools, it will be their fourth meeting of the season. The Knights hold a 3-0 edge.

Kuemper is now 13-11 on the year, while Carroll, winners of six straight, is 20-5.

Thursday night, he heard the crack of Al Oliver's bat and the wind of his pitches blowing by batters.

Both kinds of noises were significant to the Pittsburgh Pirate left-hander. The first provided needed therapy and the second a needed victory, as the Pirates beat the Cincinnati Reds 6-2.

"I stuck my feet in the Atlantic Ocean and washed away the first half of the

season," said Reuss, talking about his dismal 4-10 record before Tuesday night's All-Star Game. "It seemed the farthest thing from my mind was pitching.

"I slept late, sat on the porch, heard the crickets chirp. These are things I don't hear during the baseball season."

Reuss allowed but six hits in one of his strongest performances of the season and had plenty of help from his teammates. The Pirate defense contributed three double plays and Oliver drove in a pair of runs.
