Classic pitching as Dowling prevails, 3-0

 Third-ranked West Des Moines Dowling scored three runs in the first inning and made that stand up for a 3-0 triumph over Kuemper here Sunday night at Carroll Stadium before the largest crowd of the season. The estimated crowd count was 750.
 It was a classic pitching duel as Dowling threw Dan Mauro and Joe Stefani and the Knights went with Jeff Kruse. Mauro ran his mark to 7-0 as he allowed just two hits in five innings. Stefani, who was drafted by the Cincinnati Reds, but who signed a national letter to play baseball for the University of Iowa, threw the final two frames and struck out five batters.
 Kruse did a masterful job. The junior right hander scattered six hits and struck out eight. He is now 7-2 on the season.
 The Maroons, now 24-4 and champions of the Metropolitan

Conference, scored their quick runs as Mike Sitroneto led off by reaching on an error. Sitroneto then stole second and Rory Vacco followed with a single to put runners at second and third.
 Shortstop Jirh Ross then lined a smash off third baseman John Loew's glove for a double to make it 2-0 and after Jeff Morris grounded out, Rick Heathershaw tripled to right center to score Ross with the final run of the game.
 The Knights, now 19-7, meet Audubon at 8 p.m. Thursday night at the Carroll Stadium in a first round Class AA district test.
 Kuemper's hits came from Loew who singled in the third and Rich Berg who singled in the fifth. Berg also played well defensively, getting an unassisted double play.
JV WINS
 Ken Knight flirted with a no-hitter for six innings and finished with a two-hitter as the Kuemper junior varsity

team won, 2-0, to finish the season with a fine 17-5 record.
 Knight, who fanned five batters, scored the first run of the contest and the second tally came home on a triple by Darrell Henkenius and a single by Jerry Wiedemeier.
 Dowling's jv record is now 15-7.

Kuemper gains split

DENISON — Kuemper split a doubleheader with the Monarchs here Friday night. The Knights won the opener, 8-7, in five innings to extend their winning streak to six, but dropped the second game in 10 innings, 9-8.
 More injury woes hit the Knights. Kirk Lengeling, who was scheduled to hurl against Dowling Sunday night, injured his ankle in the second game and is out indefinitely.
 Another Kuemper pitcher is already out. Paul Baldus went

into the hospital Wednesday with a bad back and his status is unknown. Another Kuemper starting player, Dave Diers, who has been bothered by a bad ankle, is playing, but is not at 100 per cent.
FIRST GAME
 Sophomore Kevin Masching making his first varsity start, went the route, scattering four hits and allowing just two earned runs.
 Denison built up a 6-1 lead after the first two frames, but Kuemper exploded for seven

runs in the third. The big hits were a three-run double by Jeff Tiefenthaler and a three-run homer to left by Darrell Henkenius.
SECOND GAME
 Denison's Tom Koch singled with the bases loaded to give his club the second game win. His hit came off Masching who relieved Tiefenthaler who went the first nine innings and gave up nine hits and fanned 17.
 Dennis Woodward, who suffered the loss in the first

game, picked up the victory. A five run Kuemper sixth inning tied the contest at six-all. The key hits were run-scoring singles by Mike Harman and Jim Hinners. The Knights took an 8-6 lead in the seventh as Scott Irlbeck homered with one out. Harman then singled and scored on a drop fly ball in right.
 Denison sent the game into extra innings as Dan Mork
