

# Carroll drops two; faces Breda tonight

Carroll closed out their Midwest Conference season over the weekend, dropping two games.

On Saturday night, the Tigers lost 11-0 in five innings at home to Jefferson and on Friday, they lost a 9-4 decision at Audubon.

Carroll, which finished at 4-10 in loop action, faces St. Bernard of Breda at 8 p.m. tonight at Carroll Stadium in a first round Class A sectional tournament game. Manning and Lake City square off at 6.

Jefferson's big inning was

the third when they scored seven times.

The Tigers maaged just three singles. They were by Keith Peterson, Jim Molitor and Chris Wilkins.

Jefferson also won the junior varsity game, 7-5. Bill Peterson led the young Tigers with two hits and two rbi's.
