

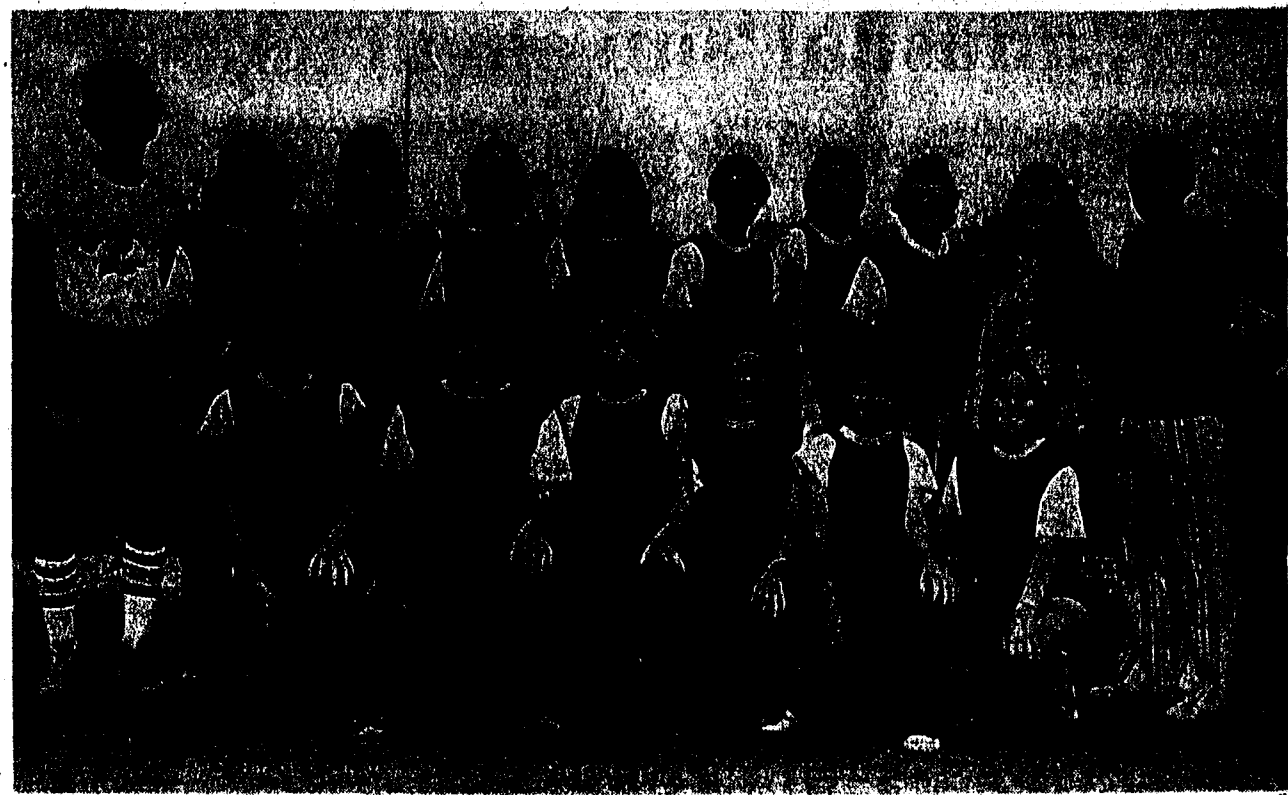
Best arm in the game

 "I don't know where you'd find a better arm. If you went looking for the best arm you could find, that's the one you'd settle for."
 That was Manager Bob Lemon speaking about Ron Guidry, the New York Yankees' ace left-hander. And Lemon should know what he was talking about.
 Not only is he a Hall of Fame pitcher, but Lemon tried to acquire Guidry last year when he managed the Chicago White Sox.
 Lemon was the Yankees' pitching coach two years ago when Guidry was a seldom-used rookie.
 "I knew he was a great prospect," Lemon said Thursday night after Guidry boosted his record to 16-2 with a three-hit 9-0 shutout over the Milwaukee Brewers. "When you saw that arm, you had to fall in love with it."
 In other American League games, the Boston Red Sox edged the Cleveland 5-5 in 13 innings, the Baltimore Orioles nipped the Kansas City Royals

3-2, the California Angels trounced the Oakland A's 16-5 and the Toronto Blue Jays defeated the White Sox 7-3.
 Guidry, who struck out nine Brewers and took over the AL lead with 182, was surprised at his sharp three-hitter.
Red Sox 6, Indians 5
 Rick Burleson's single capped a two-run rally in the bottom of the 13th inning. Burleson's smash caromed off shortstop Tom Verzyer's glove and Gary Hancock, running for George Scott, who had doubled, raced home. The Red Sox tied the game earlier in the inning when the leadoff batter, Butch Hobson, was safe when first baseman Andre Thornton dropped his pop fly. The Red Sox trailed 4-1, but Fred Lynn hit a two-run homer in the sixth inning and Jim Rice tripled home the tying run in the seventh.
Orioles 3, Royals 2
 Lee May, hitless in his last 10 trips, rapped a tie-breaking two-out single in the eighth inning after Ken Singleton tied the score with a two-run

homer in the sixth. Doug Bird was charged with the loss even though he was removed before any runners reached base in the eighth.
Angels 16, A's 5
 Lyman Bostock drove in four runs, including a bases-loaded triple, Don Baylor collected two doubles and a single and drove in three runs and Joe Rudi homered to pace an 18-hit California attack. Winning pitcher Frank Tanana, 15-7, gave up 11 hits and all five Oakland runs —

including a three-run homer to Willie Horton — before leaving after seven innings.
Blue Jays 7, White Sox 3
 Rico Carty's two-run homer snapped a tie in the seventh inning and Jerry Garvin snapped a three-month, 10-game losing streak, although he needed help from Victor Cruz in the eighth. Carty's homer, his 19th, gave him 66 RBI for the season, a record for the 2-year-old Blue Jays. Doug Ault and Ron Fairly had 64 last year.

The Dodgers thundered 16 hits off San Francisco ace Vida Blue and two successors for a rousing 12-2 victory that left Los Angeles and the Giants with identical 67-48 records in the National League West.

While the Dodgers and San Francisco deadlocked in the frantic race for first place, the Cincinnati Reds were clobbered 15-3 by the San Diego Padres, but remained just one-half game off the pace. However, they are now in third place rather than second.

In the only other NL game, the Philadelphia Phillies downed the Pittsburgh Pirates 3-1 and upped their lead in the

NL East to 3½ games over the Chicago Cubs.

Reggie Smith led the Dodgers' biggest attack in nearly two months with a home run and three singles to account for five runs. Ron Cey slugged his 14th homer and Steve Garvey had a bases-loaded triple, a double and a single. The victory was Los Angeles' sixth in a row.

Blue, 16-5, was knocked out in the fourth inning as his 10-game winning streak came to a resounding halt.

Welch, now 4-0, hurled his second straight victory over San Francisco. He launched the Dodgers on their latest winning streak with a 2-0 shutout of the Giants last Saturday.

Jack Clark slugged a two-out homer in the top of the first for San Francisco, his 19th of the year and the first off Welch since he came to the big leagues nearly two months ago.

But the Dodgers came right

back against Blue with a three-run first, two on Smith's mammoth home run.

Padres 15, Reds 3

Gene Tenace drove in five runs with a three-run homer and a two-run double and Randy Jones evened his record at 10-10 as the Padres snapped a five-game losing streak. Tenace's sixth-inning homer made the score 8-3 and came off loser Mike LaCoss. It was his 13th home run of the season and the Padres' first since July 30. The Padres then sent 12 men to the plate in the seventh inning and scored six more runs on seven hits off Dave Tomlin and Tom Hume.

Phillies 3, Pirates 1

Dick Ruthven pitched a five-hitter for his fifth consecutive victory, tripled home the tying run in the third inning and scored the winner on Larry Bowa's double. Since coming to the Phillies on June 15 from Atlanta, Ruthven has posted an 8-2 record to boost his overall mark to 10-8. One of the Pirates' hits was Dave Parker's 18th home run of the season.

Tjaden hot for all-stars

FORT DODGE, Iowa (AP) — Jill Hardin of Mediapolis canded a 6-foot jump shot with 13 seconds remaining Thursday to give the East a 68-66 victory over the West in a high school girls' all-star basketball game at Fort Dodge.

The scrimmage was the second of two played during the Girls Union Coaching Summer School. The West team won Wednesday.

The East squad led 30-26 at halftime but had to rally in the fourth quarter after trailing 52-46 after three quarters.

Sheila Lynch of Cedar Rapids Prairie again led the scoring with 20 points. Vinton's Mona Mossbarger scored 13 points, Hardin added 12 points and Waukon's Kris Spiegler 10 for the East.

In double figures for the West team were Lisa James of Belmond with 16 points, Cindy Dreesen of Inwood West Lyon with 15, Jo-Ann Tjaden of Lake View-Auburn with 14 and Connie Newlin of West Des Moines Valley with 10.
