

Slocum pitches and bats Trojans past Tigers

SCRANTON—Jerry Slocum pitched and batted Scranton to a 9-3 triumph over Carroll in baseball action here Tuesday night, spoiling the debut of new Tiger coach Rich Stoffers.

Slocum allowed four hits and struck out five, but his bat was even more effective. He went four-for-four, including a double and two runs batted in. Steve Appel and Jeff Monthei each add two hits for Scranton, now 2-0. Appel also drove in three runs and Monthei two.

The Trojans grabbed a 2-0 lead in the first. After Carroll tied it at 2-2 in the top of the fourth, the winners went ahead for good in their fourth at 4-2 and put the game away with five more runs in the fifth.

The Tigers got their first run in the third as John Dirks and Chris Wilkins walked. Dirks came home on a single to center with two outs by pitcher Scott Hackett.

Roger Bock got Carroll's second run in the fourth, scoring on a double steal.

Bock raced in from third as Keith Petersen stole second. Hackett got Carroll's final tally, slamming a homer to left to lead off the sixth inning. "Keith Petersen played a good game at third," Stoffers said. "It's a new position for

him and he had six assists." "I thought Hackett pitched a good game," Stoffers added. "We just made some mental mistakes. Overall, I was generally pleased with the way we played." Carroll travels to Lake City

for an 8 p. m. game tonight. On Friday, they will open their home season against St. Bernard of Breda. A junior varsity game will start at 6 p. m.






