Masching fires two-hit job as Knights roll in 5

Kuemper used a strong pitching performance from junior Kevin 'Cork' Masching to whip error-prone Webster City, 10-0, here Wednesday night in five innings.

Masching, a righthander, who was 7-0 on the junior varsity last year and 1-1 on the varsity squad, looked sharp.

He allowed just two hits in his stint. He gave up two misjudged fly ball hits, a single in the fourth by Jeff Rohlf and a double in the fifth to designated hitter Mike Heater.

Other than that, Masching was superb. He fanned 11 and walked just two.

The Knight pitching staff has now given up just five hits in two games over 12 innings. Three hurlers, Jeff Tiefenthaler, Jeff Kruse and Masching have fanned a total

of 29 batters.

Kuemper, now 2-0, took advantage of four Lynx errors in the second inning to score four runs to make it a 5-0 game. The only hit in the frame by Kuemper came from Dave Diers who delivered a two-run single.

Diers and Kruse were Kuemper's hitting attack. Both had two hits as the Knights only managed four in the game off of two Lynx pitchers.

It was Kruse's single to center with one out in the fifth that score Diers from third to end the game. Diers had led off the inning with an infield hit, stole second and went to third on a ground out.

For the game, Webster City committed nine errors.

Kuemper hosts Harlan tonight, starting with a junior varsity contest at 6 p. m.

Jochims bringing boxing to Carroll on June 29th

Boxing is coming to Carroll, thanks to Jeff Jochims.

It's not certain if it is a first, but for many years the sport has been absent in the area.

Jochims, disc jockey, bar and motel owner, is now a fighter and promoter.

On Friday night, June 29th, in the Eastwood-Showroom parking lot, beginning at 7 p. m., boxing will make its return to the area. Rain date is June 30th.

"The fights will run continuous," said Jochims Wednesday. "There will be a bout every half hour with each one being three, two minute rounds.

Jochims is bringing in Ron Stander, Remember Stander. He's was the Council Bluffs man who fought Joe Frazier eight years ago in Omaha for the world heavyweight crown and lost.

Stander will be the referee for all of the fights and he also will give a clinic.

"Some people are calling it the fight of the decade in Carroll County," Jochims said, referring to his one round

exhibition with Stander which is already on the program.

"We hope to have 12 to 14 bouts," continued Jochims and two women from Ames are thinking about coming and fighting.

Jochims promised the event would be of serious nature.

"There will be weight divisions," he noted. They will be 150 pounds and under; 150 to 175; 175 to 200; and 200 and over.

"We also will take any two fighters who want to be paired no matter what their weight," Jochims said.

"This event is licensed by the Iowa Boxing Commission and the World Boxing Association," Jochims said. "We have to follow their rules."

"There will be no entry fee, but fighters will have to come out to the Eastwood and sign-up and the deadline is Friday, June 15th," he said.

According to Jochims, fighters will be required sometime before June 29th to get a physical and bring a sign affidavit from his or her doctor.

"There will be a physician on hand at the fights and all participants will be

required to wear protective gear," Jochims said. "In no way, will we allow any fight to get out of hand."

Jochims had several reasons for promoting the event.

"I wanted to promote the sport in the area. This will be the first attempt ever in the county and I want to make it a regular event. Also, boxing is rising in popularity."

Jochims would also like Carroll someday to have their own boxing club to send fighters to the Iowa Golden Gloves tournament in Des Moines.

There are many smaller towns than Carroll that have programs.

The fights are open to anyone in the state and persons must be 18 years old.

"I'm urging local boys to participate," Jochims said.

Jochims said local officials and sports figures will be the judges.

Advanced ticket sales will start June 6th at the Eastwood-Showroom. Jochims hopes to have other ticket outlets soon.

Carroll grabbed a 2-0 lead in the first on Onken's two-run double. Lake City made it 2-2 in their first on a single by McCaulley and a fly ball by Scott Johnson.

Lake City's Rick Snyder and Carroll's Roger Bock both pitched well.

Snyder scattered eight hits and struck out 15, while Bock, after a slow start, gave up just seven hits, four of them to McCaulley.

"Sanford and Onken had good hitting for us," Stoffers

said. "Also, Bock started slow, but pitched a real fine game."

"It was a real fine game," the young Tiger coach added. "We saw some positive things we didn't see the night before."

The Tigers open their home season Friday night against Breda. A jv game will start at 6 p. m.
