## Carroll stuns Kuemper with 9 runs in 2 frames

The Carroll baseball team didn't want to be outdone by their counterparts, the Tigerettes softball team.

On Monday night, Leesa Dettbarn's Tigerettes shocked Kuemper, 10-8.

Guess what happened Thursday night? Rich Stoffers' Tigers shocked eighth-ranked Kuemper, 11-10, rallying for nine runs in the final two innings.

It was like David meeting Goliath. The Tigers had plenty of help from the Knights as the losers committed error after error in the final two innings.

But the Tigers earned the victory. They got the hit when they needed it and hustled all the way.

It was just back on June 7th that Kuemper romped to a five inning, 19-4 win over the Tigers.

The Tigers entered Thursday night's contest with just one win in 16 games, but don't tell them that. Kuemper came into the contest with a 16-2 mark.

The Tigers trailing 8-2 heading into the top of the sixth got things rolling as Duane Onken led off with a

single. Then winning pitcher Scott Hackett doubled to put runners at second and third.

Jason Sanford, who scored three times, then doubled to right to make it 8-4. After Roger Bock reached on an error, another Kuemper error made it 8-5 and then later Jim White's ground out, scored Bock to make it 8-6.

Lon Brinks' safety squeeze bunt in the bottom of the sixth scored pinch-runner Mark Mclellan to give Kuemper a 9-6 lead.

And then the roof fell in on losing pitcher, Jeff Kruse and his teammates.

Carroll sent nine men to the plate in the seventh and Chris Wilkins got the winning rally going by singling.

Onken then reached on an error and Hackett then drilled a single to score Wilkins to pull the Tigers within 9-7. Sanford then ripped a single to load the bases.

On the next play, Bock hit a grounder to Kruse who threw home for the force out, but catcher Darrell Henkenius couldn't hold on.

Pinch-runner Greg Forbes then knotted the game at nine as he raced home on a pass ball. Then Kruse threw wildly to third on a pickoff attempt to score Sanford and Bock with the go-ahead runs.

Carroll had to hold then as Dave Diers reached base with one down and went all the way to third on two throwing errors.

Mike Harman then drilled a double to right to score Diers, but Carroll executed perfectly as Harman tried to stretch his hit to a triple.

Rightfielder Sanford threw in to second baseman John Dirx who then rifled a strike to third basemen Keith Petersen who tagged out Harman.

Kruse then walked and the Knights had life. But Hackett answered the challenge by getting clean-up batter Randy Heller to ground back to the mound and it was it for Kuemper and a wild celebration for the Tigers.

Henkenius and Diers were the Knight sparkplugs early in the game as they each finished with three hits. Henkenius also had two rbi's and Diers scored three times and drove in three runs.

Henkenius got Kuemper started with a two-run double in the first.

After the Tigers tied it in the second with the help of a Knight error, Kuemper took a 3-2 lead in their second as Diers singled in a run.

Kuemper made it 5-2 in the fifth as Kevin Ausman singled home two runs and they added three more in the frame on a two-run single by Diers and an overthrow.

Kuemper is scheduled to play in the Dowling tournament Saturday at 6 p.m. against Davenport Assumption, while Carroll was to host Jefferson tonight.

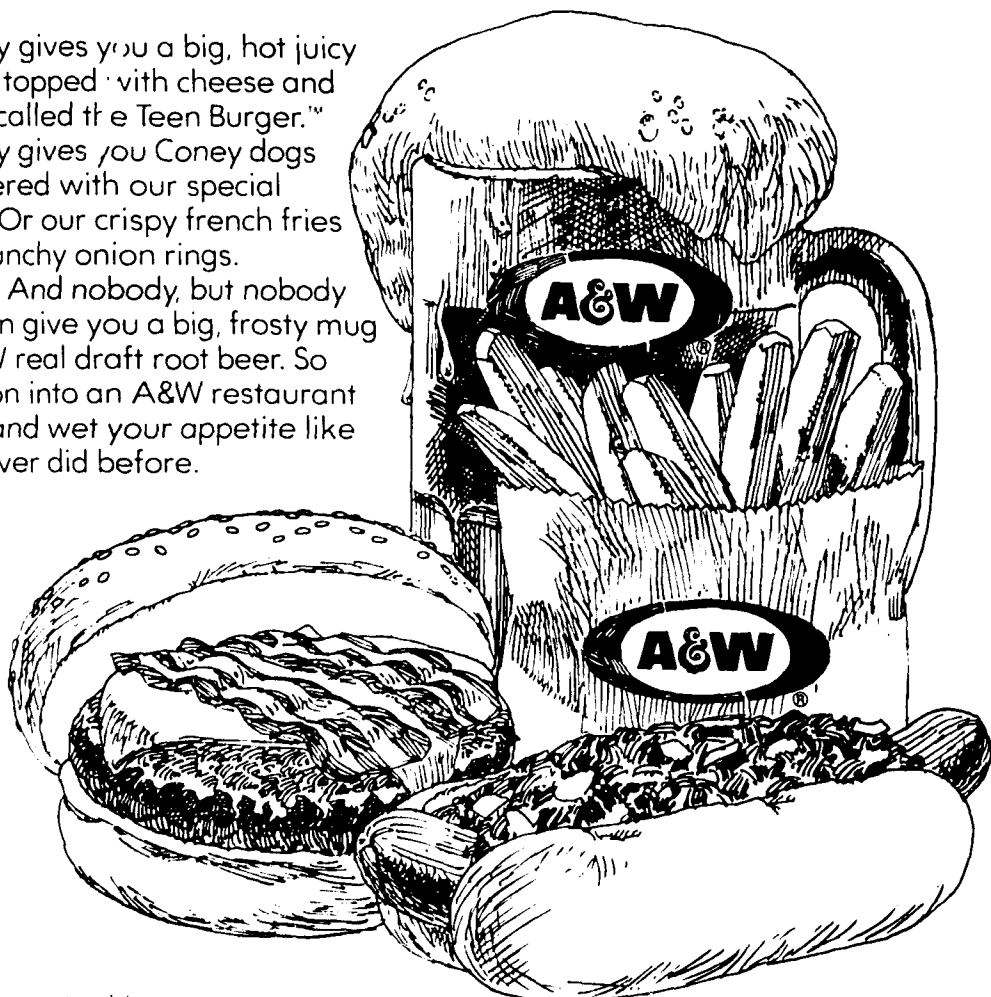

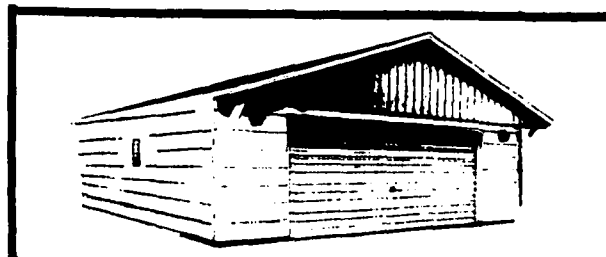
