

Carroll girls capture first conference victory, 11-1

The Carroll girls captured their first Midwest Conference softball victory here Monday night, rolling to a five-inning 11-1 win over St. Edmond of Fort Dodge.

The Tigerettes gave up a run in the first, but then they took over.

Carroll tied it in their first, made it 3-1 in the second and 4-1 in the third and finished off the Galettes with seven runs in the fourth.

"Our pitching has struggled all season, but Deb Watts came through and pitched a fine game," Carroll coach

Leesa Dettbarn said. "Brenda Brincks made a key play in the fourth inning for us," added Dettbarn. "She caught a fly ball in center and threw out the runner at home for a double play," added Dettbarn.

"We did a lot of things well," continued the Carroll coach. "We out-hit them, played errorless ball and took advantage of the breaks."

Deb Hugelback's sacrifice fly drove in Beth Blohm with Carroll's first run. Blohm had singled and moved to third on a single by Brincks.

In the second, the Tigerettes got runs as Nancy Beck singled and Rhonda Wittrock walked. Both scored later on errors.

In the third, Hugelback walked and then Gloria Gipson singled for Carroll. Beck then reached on an error

and Wittrock followed with a fielder's choice to score Hugelback. In the fourth, Lori Norgaard started Carroll's big inning by reached on an error. Brincks and Hugelback then singled to load the bases. The next four batter then

reached on errors to score four runs. Blohm then singled home a run and then Kathy Jandt scored on Janie Petersen's groundout.

Wittrock scored the final run on Norgaard's single. Carroll lost the junior varsity game to St. Edmond.

FORT DODGE—Carroll almost knocked off Midwest Conference baseball leader St. Edmond here Monday night, but the Gaels scored two unearned runs in the second inning to gain a 2-0 triumph.

Dave Conell scattered five hits for the winners as they upped their mark to 8-1 in league play and 19-4 overall.

Scott Hackett pitched a fine game for the Tigers. He gave up just three hits and struck out six.

Steve Shanks started the Gaels' scoring by singling. Dave Bianchi then sacrificed him to second. Rob Huesch and Jim Ostrander then walked to load the bases.

Ken Kommes then hit a grounder to third. Keith Petersen threw home for the force out, but on the attempted double play at first, catcher

Roger Bock's throw was off and two runs scored.

Carroll, now 1-9 in conference play and 3-16 overall, threatened in the first loading the bases and again in the fourth when they had runners at second and third with one out.

"Hackett pitched a fine game, but didn't get enough support," Tiger coach Rich Stoffers noted.
