Big day for Heisterkamp as Knights gain sweep at Heelan

SIoux CITY—It was a big day here Sunday for Kuemper sophomore Jon Heisterkamp who helped lead Kuemper to a sweep of Heelan in baseball. In his first varsity at bat, Heisterkamp hit a grand slam home run in the first game, that coming in the fourth inning as the Knights scored a 16-13 triumph.

Then in the second game shortened to six innings, Heisterkamp's three-run double in the fifth was the key blow as the Knights took an 8-4 lead, with a five-run inning and held on for an 8-7 victory. For the day, Heisterkamp came up with eight runs batted in, four in each game. In the opener, the game was tied 11-11 after four innings, but Kuemper then scored five runs in the fifth for a 16-11 edge.

Dean Steinkamp, another sophomore, got the win on the mound. He also clubbed three hits and drove in two runs. Russ Nieland, also a sophomore, added two hits. In the second game, Russ Berg chipped in with two hits as Dale Oswald got the victory. "They weren't classic games," Kuemper coach Bill Wieland said who is now just nine short of 100 wins at the school. "You have to attribute a lot to the field conditions. They were poor. I'm not making any excuses. It's better to win than to lose."

"Scott Cawley played just super defense," added the coach. Kuemper entertains strong St. Albert of Council Bluffs tonight, starting at 6 p. m. with the junior varsity contest. St. Albert has all but one player back from last year's team which finished second in the state in their class.
