## Tigers pick up fourth victory, 14-4

JEFFERSON—First-year Carroll head baseball coach Warren Rudkin and his team came up with a big victory here Thursday night, whipping Jefferson, 14-4, after trailing 4-0 through the first three innings.

The victory evened the Tigers' Midwest Conference record at 2-2, good for a third-place tie with Perry, but it also marked their fourth win of the season, one more than they had all last year.

The Tigers will try to even their mark at 5-5 tonight when they travel to Audubon. A junior varsity game will start things at 6 p. m.

Carroll took the lead for good in the fourth against the

Rams as they tallied six times. The key blow was a two-run single by Chris Wilkins. Another key play was on a ground ball hit by Rex Mitchell which went for an error, allowing two more runs to score.

Carroll put the game away with five more runs in the fifth, highlighted by a run-scoring double by first baseman Gary Benedict and a run-scoring triple by Jim White who was perfect.

White went three-for-three, scored three times and drove in two runs as did Wilkins and Benedict.

Roger Bock went the distance for the Tigers, scattering eight hits and fanning six.

He did walk six batters, but Rudkin praised his pitcher. "Roger pitched a pretty good game," the coach remarked. "He got into trouble several times, but worked his way out of it."

"We also played very good defense," added Rudkin. "Peterson (Paul) made several real fine plays at shortstop that got us out of some trouble."

On the other side, the Jeffettes collected 14 hits off of Carroll starting pitcher Angie Nobiling and one off of reliever Lori Norgaard, but with the tying runs on bases in the top of the seventh, Norgaard got Carroll out of a

jam to preserve the win.

The Tigerettes got all of their runs in three innings. They scored six in the third, five in the fourth and seven in the fifth.

Jefferson made it sticky with a six-run seventh after earlier leading 5-0.

Julie Dostal got two of the Tigerettes' four hits. One of them was a three-run double. She finished with three rbi's.

Beth Blohm and Norgaard got the other hits. Blohm had a double and Norgaard had a single.

The first five hitters in the line-up did the damage for Jefferson. Michelle Ford was three-for-four, sister Janelle was two-for-four, Cindy

Schirmbeck was two-for-four, Sue Sherlock was two-for-six and losing pitcher Sam Schaal was two-for-four.

In the rbi department, Schirmbeck had four for the losers.

Defensively, shortstop Blohm led Carroll. She made two leaping catches and turned them both into double plays.
