Play to resume Sunday in third inning

Rain halts Kuemper-Denison title game

Kuemper and Denison will have to wait until Sunday, July 5 to decide who is champion of the Kuemper Invitational baseball tournament.

The Knights' and Monarchs' game was suspended in the third inning here Sunday night because of rain.

When the game resumes at 8 p. m., Denison will be at bat in the last of the third with the bases loaded and no outs and a one-ball count on Jon Wiebers. The Knights, who were shooting to give coach Bill Wieland his 100th career victory at the school, held a 2-0 lead.

Kuemper got a run in the first as Dean Steinkamp singled and later scored on a

double by Scott Cawley.

The Knights got their other run in the third as Al Loew singled home Russ Berg.

In the consolation championship game earlier Sunday night, St. Albert of Council Bluffs whipped Sioux City North, 8-1, to improve their record to 15-12. North is now 7-16.

Earlier Sunday in one semifinal, Denison nipped Council Bluffs Thomas Jefferson, 3-2, in eight innings on Mike Rowedder's single.

Denison, which is ranked fourth in the state in Class 3A, improved their mark to 14-3 with the victory.

Thomas Jefferson slipped to 8-12 with the defeat.

In the other semi-final, Kuemper upped their season mark to 10-8 by rallying from

a 6-4 deficit to claim a 7-6 decision over Harlan.

The Knights, who banged out 11 hits, rallied with three runs in the fifth to give the mound victory to Mike Brinks in relief of Dean Steinkamp.

Steinkamp led the Knights against Harlan, which fell to 7-6, by banging out three hits, including a run-scoring double in the fifth.

Jim Ericson and Al Loew each added two hits for the Knights.

Kuemper-St. Albert
In the first round Saturday afternoon, Kuemper exploded for five runs in the sixth inning to beat St. Albert, 9-5, and give the pitching win to Jeff Hinners who relieved Steve Loneman in the third inning. The big blow in the Knights'

five-run sixth was Ericson's two-run double and a rbi single by Scott Cawley.

Ericson and Steinkamp led the Knights with two hits each. One of Steinkamp's hits was a triple.

Carroll-St. Albert
Carroll didn't fare well in the tournament, losing to St. Albert, 8-4, and to Harlan, 9-7.

The Falcons built up a 6-0 bulge on the Tigers through the first five innings.

Carroll, now 5-9 on the year, got their first run in the sixth as Roger Bock scored on a double by Rex Mitchell.

In the seventh, the Tigers made it respectable as they tallied three times. In the seventh, Scott Steffen had a run-scoring single and Gary Benedict had a single. Mitchell's double in the

sixth was the first Carroll hit off of pitcher Jeff Stokes.

Carroll-Harlan

In the fifth, Carroll took a 6-5 lead with the help of two Harlan errors, the last one, a drop fly in right field.

Paul Peterson led the Tigers with three hits, including a triple. Gary Benedict and Tony Puffett added two hits as did Steffen.
