News blackout in strike

WASHINGTON (AP) — The mouthpieces have been gagged in the baseball talks — once they leave the negotiating table. Whether that means stadiums will soon ring with the cry of "Play ball!" remains to be seen. The two sides in the 40-day-old strike were to resume negotiations over the issue of free-agent compensation at

9:30 a.m. EDT today, with a news blackout imposed at the suggestion of Labor Secretary Raymond Donovan.

Donovan was due back at today's talks after spending some four hours with the two sides Monday, the first session in Washington after more than two months in New York. "We've had face-to-face

talks all afternoon. There's a press blackout," said Kenneth Moffett, acting head of the Federal Mediation and Conciliation Service and the mediator for almost two years in baseball's war over free-agent compensation. Moffett refused to discuss what went on at the session in the federal agency's downtown headquarters.
