Defense to be one of the Tigers' strong points

Tony Weiler is back as Carroll High School's baseball coach as his team is busy preparing for Friday's season opening games.

The Tigers are scheduled to host Lake City in a doubleheader, starting at 6 p.m. On Saturday, they are scheduled to play at Manilla.

Weiler was the assistant coach in 1979, but then was the head man in 1980. Last year he didn't coach.

This will be only a one-year coaching situation for Weiler at Carroll. Next summer, Jim Kafer, the new football coach, will take over the baseball duties.

"Our defense should be one of our strong points," Weiler said Tuesday in an interview. "But we have a lot of positions to fill."

"In pitching, we have eight or nine kids who can throw," the coach said. "We have the depth, but we don't have a lot of experience. But I think we have some kids who can throw strikes."

In hitting, Weiler feels this year's club must develop some consistency.

Weiler also remarked that the team has worked a lot on being aggressive on the base paths.

"We hope to be a threat in that area," Weiler said.

Seven letterwinners are back from last year's team which went 7-14 under Warren Rudkin.

The senior returnees are outfielders Tony Puffett and Chris Wilkins; pitcher-infielder Jim White; and catcher-outfielder Jeff Beidler.

The lone returning junior veteran is second baseman Jay Savery.

Infielder Bob Dirx and pitcher-first baseman Dan Dreesen lettered a year ago as freshmen.

Puffett batted .333 a year ago, while Wilkins hit .200, but he missed most of last season because of an accident.

White hit .322 a year ago and pitched quite a lot, but failed to pick up a victory in four decisions.

Beidler played in only nine games a year ago and batted .250.

Savery played sparingly in 1981 and Dirx played some, hitting .125.

Dreesen slugged at a .333 pace a year ago and was 1-1 on the mound with a good earned run average of 3.33.

"We're looking for some good leadership from Wilkins and White," Weiler said. "Jay Savery and Bob Dirx have really gained some confidence in their hitting and we're looking for some good things from them."

"Dan Dreesen is working hard on his pitching and is working hard to become a good fielder," the Tiger boss said.

"Tony Puffett is a good, consistent hitter and we're looking for him to continue that this year," Weiler said.

"And in Beidler, we're looking for him to come through in places where we can play him," the Carroll coach said.

Newcomers expected to help include senior third baseman Greg Lux, senior outfielder-pitcher Steve Petersen, junior outfielder-pitcher Jeff Hackett, junior first baseman Doug Knott and junior infielder Dave Pemble.

Also, sophomores Jeff Reinart, Ken Hoffman, Jay Norgaard, Mark DeMey, Jeff Lehman and Brian Webber are expected to help.

"The sophomore group is talented and they will fill in at a lot of positions," Weiler said.

Weiler had some words to say about his newcomers:

On Lux: he's a good hitter and has really worked hard on his throwing and hitting. He plays third base.

On Petersen: he was injured last year, but we're looking for him to help us as a lefthanded pitcher.

On Hackett: he'll play outfield and do some pitching. He has good control and he working on his speed and trying to gain some strength.

On Knott: he really has improved as far as his fielding. We hope to use him at first and in pitching. He is hitting the ball well in practice.

On Pemble: he's a good fielder with a strong arm. We look for him to help as an infielder.

On Reinart: he'll do alot of catching. He has a good arm and good bat.

On Hoffman: he'll play first base and do some pitching. He has been impressive batting in practice.

On Norgaard: he'll be a first baseman and a pitcher. He also has shown signs of being a good fielder and hitter.

On DeMey: he is a good all-around player. We'll use him as an utility player.

On Lehman: he's a utility player who is willing to learn and hustles.

On Webber: he is considered a good fielder and hitter who will play second and also do some throwing.

Weiler also talked about freshman Kevin Lux, junior Chris Koster and sophomore Kerry Vanderheiden.

"Lux is a shortstop-pitcher who has good speed and works hard," the coach said.

"Koster is improved, but he needs more experience and confidence," the coach commented.

"Vanderheiden is a first baseman who is working hard," Weiler said. Assisting Weiler is Steve Kayser.

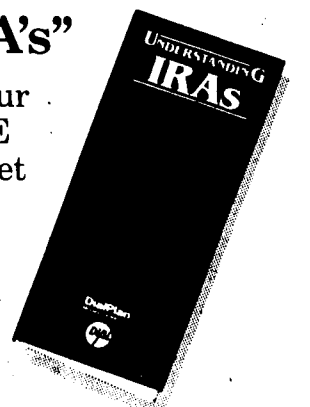


