

# Kuemper's Sievers fans 19, but loses 4-3 in 8th

It's too bad there was a loser in the Denison and Kuemper baseball game here Wednesday night, matching two long-time rivals who have played many close games.

Denison scored an unearned run in the top of the eighth inning to pull out a 4-3 victory over the Knights, spoiling a superb pitching performance by Kuemper ace Glen Sievers.

Sievers, who saw his record fall to a tough luck 2-2, fanned 19 batters and in one stretch, got six straight outs via the third strike. In the second, third, seventh and eighth innings, the big Knight righthander registered three strikeouts.

Sievers fanned Jon Wiebers, Mike Rowedder, winning pitcher Pat Drennen and Mike Francois each three times.

Sievers allowed just four hits and only one of them came after the fourth

inning. Drennen pitched well for the Monarchs as he scattered five hits and fanned nine.

Denison, now 4-1 overall and tied for 10th in the Class 3A state ratings, got their winning tally as Gary Mendlik walked with one out. He later advanced to third and scored on an error. In fact, three of the Monarchs' runs were unearned.

Kuemper had tied the game in the seventh as Tim Tegels walked. Two outs later, sophomore Marty Fay banged a deep double to right center, scoring Tegels.

Denison jumped out to a 3-0 lead before Kuemper battled back.

The Monarchs got two runs in the third as Francois led off with a sharp single to left. He later scored on an infield hit by Wiebers. Wiebers later came home on a sacrifice fly to center by designated hitter Lee Johannsen.

Denison made it 3-0 in the fourth as

Mendlik's single to center scored Charlie Kock who had walked on four pitches and stole second.

Kuemper got back in the game with two runs in the last of the sixth as Jim Ericson's bloop double to center which was lost in the lights chased home Jon Heisterkamp who had reached on an error and moved to second on a ground out.

Ericson later scored on a single to right by Russ Tigges.

Kuemper, now 4-4, will play Red Oak on the road Saturday with the game starting at 4 p.m.

### Junior Varsity to 4-1

Kuemper's junior varsity team rolled over Denison, 15-1, in five innings to improve their record to 4-1.

Southpaw John Sievers, who hurled a three-hitter with five strikeouts, supplied two hits and two rbis'.

Fay led Kuemper with three hits and four rbis'. Al Knight added two hits and three rbis'.

Denison's junior varsity mark is now 3-2.

Kuemper's next game is Friday night at Lake View-Auburn, taking on the LV-A varsity team in an 8 p. m. contest.
