Carroll wheeled out a season-high 14 hits off of Wheeler pitcher Tracy Kneven.

Chris Wilkins led the Tigers' attack with four hits in five times up. He also scored twice and drove in two runs.

Jim White, Jeff Beidler, Tony Puffett, Ken Hoffman and Bobby Dirx each added two hits apiece for Tony Weiler's club, now 1-2 in league play and 4-4 overall.

Puffett also drove in three runs and Beidler and White each drove in two.

Audubon's big hit was shortstop Clint Schmidt and leftfielder Kevin Shoemith each with three hits. Keith Croes added two hits for the winners, including a solo homer over the left field wall in the fourth.

Trailing 12-8, Carroll's first four hitters reached base in the seventh.

Hoffman led off with a single. Dirx walked and then Wilkins and White scored twice and drove in two runs.

Carroll made things very interesting, scoring five runs in the sixth, highlighted by a run-scoring double by Wilkins and a two-run single by Puffett.

Carroll got its first three runs in the third on a two-run single by Beidler and a rbi double by Puffett.

Audubon's big innings were the third and fourth frames when they scored six and four runs respectively.

Steve Davis had a two-run single in the Wheeler third and Schmidt slapped a two-run single in the fourth.

Carroll's next action is tonight at Perry, starting with a JV game at 6 p. m.
