Denison silences Carroll's bats, 7-0, 10-0

Denison silenced Carroll's bats here Wednesday night in sweeping two games from the Tigers in Midwest Conference play.

In the opener, a suspended game, the Monarchs scored a 10-0 victory in five innings as Pat Drennen and Joel Lueck combined on an one-hitter.

In the nightcap, Drennen and Mike Francois combined on another one-hitter to lead coach Jim Nurse's club to a 7-0 triumph.

The victories boosted the Monarchs to 5-1 in the conference and 8-2 overall.

The Tigers fell to 1-5 in league play and 4-7 overall and their losing streak has now hit six games, heading into a road clash Friday with Manilla.

Suspended Game

This game originally started in Denison back on June 7, but was moved here when bad lights called off the contest with the Monarchs holding a 5-0 lead in the third inning.

Denison wasted little time here in upping that lead as Lee Johannsen doubled in one run and Francois doubled in two more runs to make it an 8-0 game after three innings.

Then the Monarchs wrapped it up with two in the fifth with the help of two walks, an error and a run-scoring triple to left center by Francois.

Carroll's only hit in the contest came with two outs in the fourth on a single by Tony Puffett.

The Tigers' only other base runners were a walk to Bobby Dirx in the third and a walk to Jay Savery in the fourth.

Regular Game

Tiger sophomore pitcher Kenny Hoffman pitched a heckuva of a game for six innings against the Monarchs, holding them to just two runs, but he ran out of gas in the seventh.

Denison scored five runs in the seventh on four hits, highlighted by a run-scoring single by Jon Wiebers, a two-run double by Mike Rowedder and a rbi ground out by Shawn Kierscht.

Denison got their first run in the third on a run-scoring double by Scott Larson.

They made it 2-0 after six frames on a sacrifice fly to right by Kierscht.

Hoffman scattered nine hits and struck out four in the loss. He walked only one.

Francois got the win in the relief, pitching four hitless innings.

Carroll's only hit of the game again came by Puffett on a double to left in the second.

The Tigers' only other base runners were a walk to Chris Wilkins in the sixth and a leadoff walk to Steve Peterson in the seventh, but he was later erased on a second-to-short-to-first double play that ended the game.
