Fifth straight munny crown to Reiman

Tom Reiman shot rounds of 73, 65 and 34 for a 172 total, three-under-par, to capture his fifth straight Men's Municipal golf championship Sunday.

Reiman, who started three shots behind Kevin Vollstedt on Sunday, took command early. On his round of 65, he had a 34 and a 31. On his 31 score, he bogeyed No. 5 and No. 6.

Vollstedt, who lives at Manning, ended up second, seven shots behind. Vollstedt took medalist honors with an even par 70 on Saturday. His other rounds were 73 and 36.

Todd Pettitt took third with rounds of 71, 76 and 34 for an 181.

"I would like to thank my caddy, Lynn Tryon," Reiman commented shortly after winning another title. "Also, the course was in excellent shape. I played good, but my first round was kind of tough."

Reiman was referring to Saturday when he started with a 40, but came back to shoot a 33 for a 73.

Todd O'Donnell won the Presidential flight with a 36-hole score of 154.

Jim Macke took the first flight with a 159. Slick Haukap won the second flight with a 163.

Dale Oswald captured the third flight with a 158. Fourth flight honors went to Bob Lowe with a 165.

Vern Henkenius won the fifth flight with a 172. Sixth flight honors went to Joe Badding with an 184.

Jack Fleskes won the seventh flight with an 185 and Bruce Schulz took the eighth flight with an 198.
