Carroll Senior Little Leaguers to state meet

SIoux CITY—The Carroll Senior Little League has had a rich tradition and this year's team is no different under the direction of Ray Sapp and Verle Tiefenthaler.

The Carroll All-Stars came out of the losers' bracket here Saturday to whip previously-unbeaten Morningside twice to gain a state tournament berth.

Earlier in the double-elimination tournament, Morningside handed Carroll an 1-0, eight inning loss.

In the first game, Carroll whipped the Sioux City team, 9-4, banging out 10 hits.

Mark Feilmeier was the winning pitcher, allowing five hits and striking out eight in going the distance.

John Oswald got Carroll going with a two-run homer in the third inning.

Jerry Loew had a big hit, coming in off the bench, slamming a two-run double for Carroll.

In the title game, Carroll scored an 10-9 triumph as Oswald was the winning pitcher in relief of Roger Berg. Steve Hoffman came in the game to pitch and got a save.

Loew was again a hero for Carroll, getting a two-run pinch hit single in the top of the seventh, giving the All-Stars some breathing room.

Jim Henkenius added a two-run single for the winners who had 12 hits. Carroll will now play in the state

tournament here at Headid Park Thursday at 3 p. m. The tournament is double-elimination.

"They played their hearts out," remarked Sapp. "The whole crew did."

"They went there and had a good time and got treated well," continued Sapp. "It's a tribute to these kids who had to come out of the losers' bracket and beat Morningside twice in their own town."

Carroll is now 7-1 in tournament play.

ROSELLE—Top-ranked Schlitz of Carroll is the only unbeaten team left in the district one 16 inch slow pitch sub-state tournament.

In a class Sunday afternoon, Schlitz handed defending sub-state champion, the Arcadia Budmen, their first loss by a 10-6 score as the winners rallied from a 6-1 deficit after three innings.

Marv Glass of the Budmen was the hitting star as he slammed a three-run homer in the first inning and added a run-scoring triple later.

Schlitz took command in the game with a six-run fourth inning. Mark Heithoff was the winning pitcher.

The Breda Zekers downed the Roselle Stars in the battle for fifth and sixth-place in the tournament, taking a 11-4 decision.

The top six teams go to the state open meet, while the seventh through 10th-place teams go to the Class A state meet.

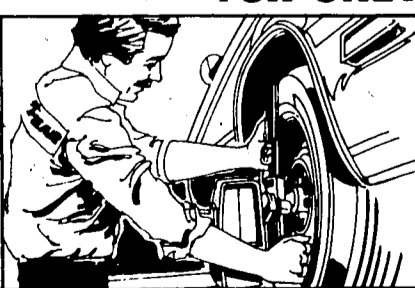
