## Farrell's hit snaps Tigerette skid, 10-9

Andrea Farrell's bloop single down the right field line with the bases loaded and no outs in the bottom of the seventh gave Carroll an exciting 10-9 Midwest Conference softball victory here Wednesday night at the Little League complex over Audubon.

The triumph snapped an eight-game losing streak for Carroll, putting their loop mark at 2-9 and overall mark at 2-14, heading into a home tilt Friday night with Lytton.

For the Wheelertettes, it marked their 11th conference loss in a row and put their overall record at 0-19.

Trudi Foval started Carroll's winning rally by leading off by reaching on an error. Lisa Anderson then ran for

Foval.

After Beth Blohm singled, Christy Griffith reached on an error to load the bases, setting up Farrell's game-winning hit which gave the mound win to Angie Nobiling who pitched the last three innings, allowing one run and no hits.

Farrell was the bat star for the Tigerettes. She also had a run-scoring single in the first and walked in the fourth to get another rbi.

Besides Farrell, Nobiling was the only other Carroll hitter to get two hits. Nobiling singled in both the first and third frames.

Audubon jumped out to a 6-3 lead after the first two frames and made it 8-3 in the top of the fourth before the Tigerettes battled back with six runs in

their fourth to take a 9-8 lead.

Audubon tied the game in the sixth as Kathy Kautzky walked and later scored on a sacrifice fly to center by Lori Foresman. Foresman also had the only extra base hit in the game, a double in the second.

Audubon won the junior varsity contest, 14-5, in five innings as Carroll didn't get a hit. Tami Tryon was the losing pitcher. Carroll is now 2-12.

Hoffman went the route, scattering three hits and striking out four as the Tigers improved their loop record to 3-7 and their overall mark to 8-12, heading into a home tilt Friday night with Perry.

Wilkins and Petersen each went two-for-three with a rbi. Jim White also got two hits.

## Outdoor Recreation Corner

### Update on fawn

Because so many readers have shown interest, I would like to give you an update on the condition of the white tailed deer fawn that was mentioned in my article two weeks ago.

I am happy to say she is doing well and is being bottle fed at the present time. If you visit Swan Lake in the next few weeks she can be viewed in the bird exhibit building. She is friendly and enjoys visitors.

### Opening Bids

The opening of bids for the Swan Lake Restoration Project will be 2 p.m. Tuesday, July 20, in the Wallace State Office Building. If the bids are close to the dollars appropriated, a contractor will be selected and approved by the Iowa Conservation Commission at their Aug. 6th meeting.

If everything goes as planned the commencing of the draining of the lake would take place around the middle of August. During the dewatering, the game fish will be seined from the lake and taken to area lakes.

No game fish have been seined out of the lake so far this summer and there are no plans to do so until the project is approved and the dewatering is taking place.

The Conservation Commission seined for flat head minnows a couple of weeks ago. These minnows are used as feed for game fish being raised in the state fish hatcheries.

### Booth at Fair

The Carroll County Conservation

Board will be sharing a booth with the Carroll County Soil Conservation District at the Four County Fair July 11-14.

The Conservation Board staff will have a display board, showing outdoor activities available in the county park and recreation areas, slides of the areas and brochures.

If you are at the fair come in and visit with us.

### Fishing Good

The fishing on the Raccoon River has been good to excellent for channel catfish this past weekend. Several nice catches were reported by the local fishermen at the county access areas. Liver seems to be a very popular catfish bait at the time.

### Reminder to Hunters

I want to remind area hunters that loaded-uncased weapons are illegal in the county conservation board hunting areas from March 1 to Sept. 1, except at the practice range located at Bennett Access.

At all other areas, it is illegal to target practice during this period of time. People found violating this rule will be summoned. Thank you for your cooperation.

### Weekend was busy

The 4th of July weekend was a busy one in the Carroll County Park and Recreation Areas. An excellent crowd was on hand at Swan Lake to celebrate the 4th. One hundred fifty camping units visited Swan Lake during the weekend, with no major disturbances in the areas.
