

Tigers defeat Webster City for second victory

Carroll got a solid pitching performance from Kyle Semprini and had three players with two hits apiece for a 9-4 win over Webster City in non-conference baseball Thursday night.

Semprini hurled six innings for the win, allowing three runs (1 earned) on four hits, walking none and striking out five. Adam Klocke pitched one inning, giving up one run on two hits with one strikeout.

Greg Schulz led the Tigers at the plate, going 2 for 4 with three RBI. Schulz hit a RBI single in the third and a two RBI double in the fourth. Chase Steinkamp was 2 for 3 with a RBI and Addison Patrick 2 for 4.

"A good, solid all-around team game," Carroll coach Dirk Troutman said. "Great pitching for another night with no walks, which is key for any pitcher. And defensively our middle infield and all over the place, we made great plays all night. Our pitchers did a great job throwing strikes and we made the plays defensively. A good way to start the season, 2-0."

Carroll scored two runs in the first inning, one in the second, one in the third, four in the fourth and one in the fifth. Webster City scored one run in the first inning, two in
