

Carroll Racks Breda, 5-3; Kuemper Wallops Audubon, 16-0

Dryden and DenAdel Set Tiger Pace

BREDA — Carroll's battling Tigers shook off an early deficit with a four-run explosion in the third and rapped Breda, 5-3, in a West Central League baseball game here Wednesday.

Tom Dryden's four-hit pitching and Phil DenAdel's key double in the third inning highlighted Carroll's victory.

"This makes it all worthwhile," an elated Coach Bill T. von said as his Tigers turned in their come-from-behind win. "Now we know we have a good two-man pitching staff," the Carroll coach said.

Dryden was touched for a pair of runs in the first frame as he made his first start in high school ball. Orner, Breda's lead-off batter, opened with a double and rode home on Leonard Snyder's single.

Snyder took second on a stolen base and went to first on a passed ball. After Neu-

mayer had popped to second, Tom Polking grounded to second and Snyder scooted home to give the Bobcats a two-run cushion. Wernimont ended the first inning uprising by grounding to short.

The Tigers waited until the second time around in the batting order before they roughed up starter Tom Polking. They had the Breda hurler in hot water during the first frame but he extricated himself with a pair of strike-outs.

Art Fisher led off the top of the third with a single and Tom

Polking popped to second, Subbert drew a walk. Gary Sundermann popped to second, but Denny Wilkins lived on an error by the third baseman and Fisher sped home with the first Tiger run. Doug Ohde went down on strikes for the second out.

Phil DenAdel picked on a Polking pitch for a clutch double that scored Subbert and Wilkins and Carroll had 3-2 lead.

A passed ball put DenAdel on third and Dryden drew a pass. A wild pitch let DenAdel come home as Dryden moved to first before Polking put out the fire by fanning Richardson.

Breda struck back in the fourth with a belated rally after two were out. Arlan Woerdehoff singled and scored all the way from first on Tom Stork's single. Stork tried to stretch his hit and was thrown out to end the inning.

The Tigers bombed Polking from the hill in the top of the fifth as Sundermann and Wilkins put together back-to-back singles but Sundermann got caught at third.

Snyder came in relief for Breda and got Ohde on strikes before issuing a pass to DenAdel. Dryden then popped to first to end that threat.

Carroll got a cushion run in the sixth when Scott Richardson led off with a walk and moved up on Steve Stroh's sacrifice. Fisher singled and Richardson rode home with the fifth Carroll run and ended the scoring. Dryden got stronger as the game progressed and held the Bobcats hitless during the final three frames. Staiert and Collison Set Knight Pace

The Kuemper Knights romped to their fourth straight win and maintained a half-game bulge at the top of the West Central League standings with a 16-0 five-inning victory over Audubon here Wednesday.

Louie Billmeier hurled a masterful one-hitter as he blanked the Wheelers over the required five-inning route before the contest was called on the basis of the 10-run rule.

Dave Staiert picked on Audubon pitching with a vengeance as he went three-for-three with a triple, double and single.

Leo Collison also got into the extra base act with a pair of doubles.

There was no doubt about the outcome of the game after the Knights picked up a two-run cushion in the first. They added three more in the second and another pair in the third before wrapping it up with a nine-run outburst in the fourth.

In other action around the league, Manning shocked Jefferson, 4-1, behind Curt Grimm's five-hitter; Denison got past Perry, 5-3; and Carroll rapped Breda, 5-3.

Walks to Dave Schmitz and Jim Irlmeier set the stage for a two-run double by Collison in the first frame and the Knights were off and running.

Staiert led off the bottom of the second with a long double to left field. After Rollie Kitt popped to short, Tom Louis drew a walk.

Frankie Golwitzer singled to right to plate Staiert and took second on an error by the fielder. Louis raced home on the error and Kuemper was in front 4-0.

Ernie Golwitzer and Irlmeier drew successive passes to load the bases and signal the departure of Audubon starter Doug Taggart. Bob Gale came on in relief and walked Collison to force in the fifth run before he retired the side by getting Billmeier on a fly to center.

The Wheelers picked up their only hit in the top of the third with two down when the ninth batter in the order, Steve Byriell doubled to right. He was stranded at second when Francis Madsen tapped back to the mound.

The Knights continued the assault in the bottom of the third as Staiert started the proceedings with a triple to center and scored on Kitt's single. Kitt raced to third on an error and came home on a ground-out by Louis.

Two walks and a double steal represented a mild Audubon threat in the fourth, but Billmeier had three whiffs sandwiched around the gratis gestures and the Wheelers continued to be stymied.

Irlmeier walked to start the bottom of the fourth and went to third on Collison's double. Billmeier singled to center to plate Irlmeier, and Staiert singled to left to score Collison. Kitt was safe on an error as Billmeier scored, and Staiert came in on Larry Piroette's grounder.

Cincinnati moved into second place, three percentage points ahead of San Francisco, by trimming Houston 5-2 in a game called after six innings because of rain. The rest of the schedule — New York at Chicago, San Francisco at Milwaukee and Philadelphia at Pittsburgh — was washed out.
