

Kuemper Whips Audubon, 11-4; Breda Bombs Carroll, 9-2

11th Loop Win in Row For Knights

AUDUBON — The Kuemper Knights wrapped up their 11th consecutive league win, 11-4, over Audubon in a game of contrasts here Wednesday.

The Knights exploded for eight runs in the first and had the situation well in hand until they frittered away part of the margin in a nightmarish comedy of errors in the fifth frame.

Steve Byriel started on the mound for Audubon and was pounded off the hill before a single out was recorded in the top of the first. Byriel started his own downfall when he dropped lead off batter Frankie Golwitzers high infield pop.

Kent Casey doubled to center and the hit parade was underway. Ernie Golwitzers followed with a single to left and took another base on an error. Louie Billmeier singled to center and Rollie Kitt singled to left.

Pete Kelly drew a walk and Billmeier scored on a wild pitch. That was all for Byriel and he was replaced by Bob Gale.

Scott Wille greeted Gale with a single to center that plated Kitt. Dave Staiert reached first on a fielder's choice as Kelly was retired and continued to second when a double play throw got away from the first baseman. Wille scored on an error at the plate.

Staiert held at third. The Knights were running wild by this time and a stolen base by Keat and a ground out by Frankie Golwitzers pushed two more runs across before Casey flied to second to end the first half inning.

Terry Layland, Audubon's lead-off batter, rapped a single to right to start the bottom of the first and that was the extent of Audubon hitting off Rollie Kitt until Craig Lindholm doubled to start the bottom of the fourth. Kitt extricated himself from jams with strike-out pitches and posted a total of 15 whiffs in the game.

The Knights lost their punch at the plate during the second and third frames but regained the touch in the fifth. Kitt ignited a rally with a double to left and took third on a passed ball. After Denny Oxenford went down on a called third strike, Kitt stole home with Kuemper's ninth run. Wille popped out, but Staiert kept it alive with a walk. Larry Pirotte ran for Staiert and was cut down trying to steal second.

The bottom of the fifth was a frame the Knights would like to forget. Burdell Hansen started it with a single to center and moved to third on two wild pitches. Layland grounded to third and the throw to the plate was in time to catch Hansen and so was the tag, but the catcher dropped the ball and the first Audubon run was in.

Curt McLaughlin whiffed but Layland stole second and

moved to third on a ground out by Jim Crouse.

Kitt ran into control trouble as he wild-pitched Layland home and successively walked Lindholm and Mike Garber. Eddie Hansen fanned after Lindholm scored on a wild pitch and Garber streaked home on successive errors by the catcher and pitcher. The batter was safe at first on a dropped third strike. Then Francis Madsen fanned, and again the third strike was dropped and the batter was safe.

At that point Coach Dick Tighe reinstated the Kuemper Knights . . . See Page 7

Tigers Get Three Hits Off Snyder

Breda's Bobcats maintained a firm hold on second place in the West Central baseball league with a 9-2 victory over Carroll High here Wednesday night.

Leonard Snyder held the Tigers in check with a three-hitter while Tom Dryden yielded 10 safeties to the Bobcat swingers.

Breda jumped off to a two run lead in the top of the first as David Ortner led off with the first of his three hits. Ron Neumayer was safe on an error before Snyder moved the runners ahead with a ground out.

Mel Wernimont singled to plate the first two runs. Tom Polking duplicated the hit feat but Jim Determan hit into a fielder's choice as Polking was erased before Arlan Woerdehoff grounded out to retire the side.

The Tigers bounced back with a run in the bottom of the first as Gary Sundermann led off with a single. Terry Wenck sacrificed and Denny Wilkins grounded out as Sundermann moved up. Doug Ohde was safe on an error and Sundermann scored. Phil DenAdel stranded Ohde with a fly to short.

In the second inning, Ortner singled with two away and stole second but was left there on Neumayer's fly to short.

Carroll threatened in the

third when Sundermann and Wenck were safe on errors with one down, but Wilkins grounded to third and Ohde grounded to second to end the rally. Breda got a cushion run in the bottom of that frame when Snyder was safe on an error and stole second. Determan's single netted the run.

Tom Subbert collected Carroll's second hit with a two-out single in the fourth but didn't get beyond first as Scott Richardson went down on strikes.

Breda victimized the Tigers in the fifth when successive errors led Snyder and Wernimont live with one away. Tom Polking got on via a fielder's choice. Determan's single plated two more runs and the third tallied on a passed ball. Determan scooted home as Woerdehoff grounded out before Doug Polking finally ended that uprising with a ground out.

The visitors were in front by a 7-1 count after another out-break in the sixth. Tom Stork started it with a double. Ortner singled to score the run. Neumayer followed with another single. After Snyder popped out, Wernimont was safe on a fielder's choice but was cut down trying to steal second.

Carroll rallied for one in the bottom of the sixth. Ohde singled with one away and had to hold as DenAdel popped to third. Steve Stroh was safe on an error and Ohde scored on a bad throw before Tom Subbert ended the threat with a whiff.

Breda added a cushion run in the seventh when Tom Polking led off with a triple and

home when Determan was safe on an error in right field.

The Tigers couldn't mount a comeback in the final frame as Snyder fanned Richardson, got Dryden on a grounder to short and whiffed Jay Krogh for the final out.

Carroll's next action will be at Perry on Friday. The Tigers and Bluejays are tied for sixth in the loop standings with identical 4-7 records.

Chisox Split After Twins Check Tribe

Juan Pizarro still is a step behind Gary Peters.

The P and P pitching partners were the toast of Chicago last year as Peters won 20 games and Pizarro 19.

And Peters still is out front. He's only been relegated to the bullpen. Pizarro's been relegated to the sidelines.

Both of Manager Al Lopez' problems were in action Wednesday night, Peters making a rare appearance as a reliever and Pizarro making one of his infrequent starts, as the White Sox split a doubleheader with Washington, losing the opener 5-1 before taking the nightcap 5-0.

Pizarro, who posted a 19-9 record with a 2.56 earned run average last season, made only his seventh start of the season in the opener and made his seventh quick exit, leaving in the second inning after surrendering three hits and two runs.

The 28-year-old left-hander has a pitiful 1-2 record and a horrendous 7.20 ERA.

Peters, who compiled a 20-8 record with a 2.50 ERA in 1964, came out of the bullpen for the first time this season in the eighth inning of the nightcap, pitched to and retired one batter, and then sat down while Eddie Fisher pitched the ninth.

Like Pizarro a 28-year-old southpaw, Peters' difficulties have been similar to his partner's. Peters has a 5-5 record

but has been able to complete only one of 14 starts and has a hefty 4.00 ERA.

"If Pizarro and Peters had pitched so far as they did last year," Lopez said, "we'd be five or six games up from where we are now."

As it is the White Sox are just one game in back of the front-running Minnesota Twins, who rode three homers to a 6-3 victory over Cleveland that ended the Indians' winning streak at 10.

Elsewhere, Detroit blanked the Los Angeles Angels behind Hank Aguirre's four-hit pitching, Baltimore downed Boston 6-4 and the New York Yankees walloped Kansas City 8-3.

In the National League, San Francisco belted Pittsburgh 6-1, Cincinnati defeated St. Louis 6-2 and Milwaukee whipped the Chicago Cubs 6-2.

Jimmie Hall connected for a homer in the second inning for the Twins' first run, Bob Allison hit a pinch-hit homer with two on in the fourth to put Minnesota ahead to stay and Sandy Valdespino wrapped it up with a two-run shot in the fifth. Jim Grant, 7-2, was the winner.

Aguirre, who has lost only two games, became the AL's first nine-game winner as he posted his fifth straight victory and also drove in the only run he needed against the Angels with a second-inning single.
