They were filled with sentiment for six innings Monday night. Then Joe Christopher went and spoiled it with a bunt single leading off the seventh inning.

Billy Cowan made it even worse in the ninth inning when he slammed his first homer of the season, giving the Mets a 1-0 victory over the National League - leading Los Angeles Dodgers and Claude Osteen.

The triumph came exactly one year after Jim Bunning pitched a perfect game against the Mets for the Philadelphia Phillies, who also were in first place at the time.

The Mets appeared to be staging a fitting observance of the first anniversary, if not with a perfect game, at least with a nohitter. But Christopher broke up the celebration, and all the Mets wound up with was their second consecutive 1-0 Monday night victory.


