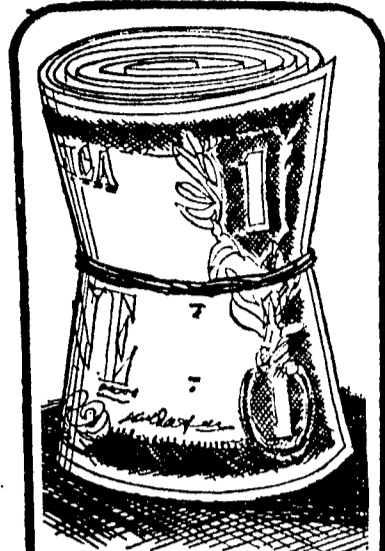


Knights Blank Lake City, 10-0; Tigers Lose to Manning, 5-3

Billmeier's No-hitter is Win No. 8

The onrushing Kuemper Knights continued their mastery of the West Central league as Louie Billmeier pinned Lake City to the ropes with a no-hitter in a five inning 10-0 game here Wednesday night.

It marked the eighth straight Kuemper triumph in league play, and it was Billmeier who provided the spark on both defense and offense. The tall Lancer fireballer had a perfect night at the plate with two singles and a double in three times at bat.

The Knights exploded for five runs in the second frame and added five more in the fourth to enable them to end the contest after four and one-half on the basis of the high school 10 run rule.

Lake City twice managed to get runners as far as second base but didn't seriously threaten beyond that point. Billmeier set the visitors down in order in the first and had two down on strikes in the second only to lose the second batter on a dropped third strike. Chuck Redenius then hit into a force and wound up on first. He died there when Tim Willis fanned.

In the third inning, Billmeier walked the first batter and struck out the second. Then Bob Lee got on via a fielder's choice and later stole second, but Duane Hoover whiffed to

end that threat. The Eagles went down in order in the fourth. With one away in the fifth, Willis lived on an error at first and stole second. He was stranded when Meinen fanned and Biederman grounded to first.

Kuemper got to starter Joe Newland in the second after going down in order in the first. Dave Staiert led off with a walk in the second and Billmeier singled to left. Leo Collison singled to left to score Staiert.

An error on a pick-off at second permitted Billmeier to take third and Collison to reach second. It turned out to be somewhat unneeded because Rollie Kitt followed with a booming triple to left-center to score the two base runners.

After Jim Irlmeier struck out, Tom Louis put down a perfect squeeze bunt that scooted Kitt home unmoled. There was only one play and that was to first, buy by the time the Eagles retrieved a wild heave the batter was

perched on third. Frankie Golwitzer was safe on an error at short as Louis scored. Dave Schmitz filed to center and Ernie Golwitzer was thrown out from catcher to first to end that rally.

The Knights got two aboard in the third but couldn't deliver.

Louis started the bottom of the fourth with a single to center. Frankie Golwitzer hit into a fielder's choice to erase Louis. Golwitzer set sail for second and continued to third on a bad throw. Kent Casey batted for Schmitz and was safe on an error as Frankie Golwitzer scored.

Ernie Golwitzer beat out a base hit down the first base line. Staiert singled to left to plate Casey, and Billmeier doubled to the left field fence to score Ernie Golwitzer and Staiert. A wild pitch let Billmeier take third.

Brian Fell came on in relief of Newland and fanned Collison, but the catcher dropped the third strike and had to throw the batter out at first. On the play, Billmeier scored

the 10th run. Kitt lifted a high fly to left and was safe when the outfielder let the ball fall out of his glove. A balk moved the baserunner to second, but Denny Oxenford went down on strikes to end the five run outburst in the bottom of the fourth.

The Knights will trek to Denison on Friday to engage the runner-up Monarchs. Dave Staiert has been nominated for Kuemper's mound duty and his probable mound opponent is Bob Lingle.

6th Frame Rally Nets Bulldog Win

MANNING — The Manning Bulldogs came from behind with a four-run rally in the sixth to defeat Carroll, 5-3, in a West Central league baseball game here Wednesday.

The visiting Tigers vaulted in front, 3-0, in the top of the fourth and then gave up a run in the bottom of the same frame.

Manning's rally in the sixth started when Nate Dappen was safe on an error in center field. He moved up on a ground out and scored on a wild pitch. That left the Bulldogs on the short end of a 3-2 score.

Gary Sundermann, Carroll pitcher, walked Dennis Ohde and Darrell Ohde in succession. Dan Pratt doubled and the Bulldogs were in front, 4-3. After Curt Grimm grounded out, Nick Dappen singled to plate Dan Pratt and Manning had a two-run cushion, 5-3.

Kuemper to Host Sectional Tourney

Kuemper, Lake View and Jefferson will host area high school baseball tournaments starting July 7, the Iowa High School Athletic Association announced Thursday.

A total of 368 Iowa High School teams will enter the summer tournaments. District meets will be held July 16 and July 19. Two sub-state tournaments of four teams each will be announced at a later date. The sub-state winners will meet for the summer championship.

Teams assigned to Carroll in the Kuemper tournament to be played in the city baseball stadium, include Carroll, Manning, Glidden-Ralston, Ar-We-Va, Kuemper and Manilla.

Lake View will host Breda (St. Bernard's), Odebolt-Arthur, Early (Crestland), Denison, Wall Lake and Lake View-Auburn. The semi-final winner at Lake View will play the semi-final winner at Carroll in a sectional final on July 14.

Jefferson will draw Paton-Churdan, Gowrie, Coon Rapids, Lake City, East Greene and Jefferson. The semi-final winner at Jefferson will play the Boone semi-final winner at Boone on July 14.

Pairings at Carroll show Carroll High vs. Manning on Wed., July 7, at 6:30 p.m.; Glidden-Ralston against the Carroll-Manning winner on Fri., July 9 at 6:30 p.m.; Kuemper vs. way.

Ar-We-Va on Wed., July 7 at 8 p.m.; and Manilla against the Kuemper Ar-We-Va winner on Fri., July 9 at 8 p.m. Semi-finals Mon., July 12 at 8 p.m.

At Jefferson, Paton-Churdan plays Jefferson, July 7, 8 p.m.; Gowrie vs. Paton-Churdan and Jefferson winner, July 9, 8 p.m.; Coon Rapids vs. Lake City, July 7, 6:30 p.m.; East Greene vs. Coon Rapids - Lake City winner, July 9, 6:30 p.m.; semi-finals July 12, 8 p.m. The Jefferson semi-finalist will play the Boone semi-finalist at Boone on July 14 at 8 p.m.

The sectional winner at Carroll will be assigned to the district at Fonda and will play the Mapleton sectional winner on July 16 at 6:30 p.m. The Fonda sectional winner and Rolfe sectional winner will play at 8 p.m. the same day. The district final will be July 19 at Fonda at 8 p.m.

Wills and Koufax Pace Dodgers Past Giants, 2-1

Maury Wills and Sandy Koufax of the Los Angeles Dodgers have put themselves into position to knock two guys out of the record book—Maury Wills and Sandy Koufax.

Wills singled twice, stole second twice and rode home on singles by Jim Gilliam twice while Koufax limited San Francisco to six hits and struck out eight as the National League leaders edged the Giants 2-1 Wednesday night.

The performances left Wills well ahead of the pace he set when he stole a record 104 bases in 1962, and kept Koufax out front of the pace he set when he established a strikeout record for left-handers by fanning 306 in 1963.

Wills now has stolen a major league-leading 41 bases in 62 games and is 16 games ahead of his own pace. In 1962, he did not pilfer his 41st base until the Dodgers' 78th game.

Koufax, meanwhile, brought his strikeout total to a major league-leading 135 for his first 15 appearances. In 1963, Koufax did not chalk up his 135th strikeout victim until his 18th time out.

The Dodgers' victory boosted their first-place edge over Milwaukee to 3 1/2 games as Philadelphia knocked off the Braves 6-2 behind the hitting of rookie catcher Pat Corrales.

Elsewhere, Pittsburgh outlasted St. Louis 10-9, Cincinnati belted the New York Mets 8-4 and Houston ended an eight-game losing streak by edging the Chicago Cubs 3-2 in 13 innings.

In the American League, the Chicago White Sox defeated Minnesota 3-1, Detroit downed Boston 9-4, Cleveland blanked Washington 5-0, Baltimore beat the New York Yankees 5-1 and the Los Angeles Angels swept a doubleheader from Kansas City 7-1 and 5-4.
